Senate Bill 415

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Adds school district board members and public charter school governing body members to list of mandatory reporters of child abuse.
