Senate Bill 416

Sponsored by Senator BEYER (at the request of Lincoln County Commissioner Claire Hall) (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Authorizes public utilities to implement charitable utility bill payment round up programs. Directs Public Utility Commission to adopt rules governing round up programs.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to coins for kids programs.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2019 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 757.
 - SECTION 2. (1) A public utility may implement a charitable utility bill payment round up program. Under the round up program, a public utility may collect, through a participating customer's bill, a charitable contribution of moneys equal to the difference between the total energy charges billed to the customer during a billing cycle and the nearest next whole dollar. A public utility that implements a round up program under this section shall:
 - (a) Identify the amount of the charitable contribution separately on bills to customers and label the amount as a "contribution to coins for kids"; and
 - (b) Provide a manner for customers to opt out of the round up program.
 - (2) Charitable contributions collected under the round up program may not be considered in any proceeding to establish rates for service and may not be expended on administration, marketing or outreach related to the round up program. Costs to a public utility related to the administration of a round up program are operational costs of the public utility.
 - (3) Charitable contributions collected under the round up program must be distributed to governmental or nonprofit entities that serve areas within the service territory of the public utility, to be used only for providing assistance and services to homeless youth. The amount of contributions distributed to be expended within a county must be equal to the proportion of moneys collected under the round up program in that county.
 - (4) A public utility may not be held liable in an action for damages brought by a utility customer resulting from contributions made by the customer under the round up program after failure by the customer to opt out of the round up program.
 - (5) The Public Utility Commission shall adopt rules governing charitable utility bill payment round up programs authorized under this section.

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
