Senate Bill 5508

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and certain federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by Employment Department.

Appropriates moneys from certain federal funds to department for certain purposes.

Appropriates moneys from Employment Department Special Administrative Fund for certain purposes.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from other federal funds. Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2019.

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4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts 6 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, as the maximum limits for payment 7 of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and 8 moneys appropriated to the Employment Department by sections 2 and 3 of this 2019 Act, 9 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds other than those described in section 2 of this 10 2019 Act, collected or received by the Employment Department:

- 11 (1) Unemployment insurance,
- 12 shared services and workforce
- 13 operations, and workforce
- 14 and economic research \$142,752,124
- 15 (2) Office of Administrative
- 16 Hearings...... \$ 29,378,697
- 17 (3) Capital improvement...... \$ 552,000
- 18 (4) Modernization Initiative...... \$ 19,857,463

19 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) There is appropriated to the Employment Department, for the biennium 20 beginning July 1, 2019, out of the modernization funds made available to the state on June

4, 2009, and July 16, 2009, under section 903(f) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1103(f)),

22 as amended, the amount of \$19,857,463 to be used under the direction of the Employment

23 Department for the purposes of administering unemployment compensation law and public

24 employment offices and for debt service and capital improvements.

(2) Expenditures of funds appropriated to the Employment Department under this section
are limited by section 1 (1) and (3) of this 2019 Act.

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<u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) There is appropriated to the Employment Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the Employment Department Special Administrative Fund established in ORS 657.822, the amount of \$25,000,000 to be used under the direction of the Employment Department for the purposes of administering unemployment compensation law

5 and public employment offices and for debt service and capital improvements.

6 (2) Expenditures of funds appropriated to the Employment Department under this section 7 are limited by section 1 (1) and (3) of this 2019 Act.

8 <u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 9 \$154,194,760 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, as the maximum limit for 10 payment of expenses from federal funds other than those described in section 2 of this 2019 11 Act collected or received by the Employment Department.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, expenditures by the Employment
Department for unemployment insurance claims from the Unemployment Compensation
Trust Fund are not limited.

(2) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, expenditures by the Employment Department
for benefits paid under the federal Trade Act and for unemployment insurance claims from
federal funds are not limited.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect
July 1, 2019.

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
