

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 5542

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after the semicolon insert “creating new provisions; amending ORS
2 274.064 and sections 1 and 2, chapter 570, Oregon Laws 2017, sections 12, 15 and 29, chapter 748,
3 Oregon Laws 2017, and section 8, chapter 87, Oregon Laws 2018; repealing section 10, chapter 748,
4 Oregon Laws 2017;”.

5 Delete lines 4 through 15 and insert:

6 “**SECTION 1.** Section 8, chapter 87, Oregon Laws 2018, is amended to read:

7 “**Sec. 8.** (1) For the biennium ending June 30, 2019, at the request of the Oregon Department
8 of Administrative Services, after the department consults with the Higher Education Coordinating
9 Commission, the State Treasurer is authorized to issue lottery bonds pursuant to ORS 286A.560 to
10 286A.585 in an amount that produces \$9 million in net proceeds and interest earnings for the pur-
11 poses described in subsection (2) of this section, plus an additional amount estimated by the State
12 Treasurer to be necessary to pay bond-related costs.

13 “(2) Net proceeds of lottery bonds issued under this section in an amount sufficient to provide
14 \$9 million in net proceeds and interest earnings must be transferred to the Higher Education Coor-
15 dinating Commission for deposit in the [*Public University Fund established under ORS 352.450, seg-*
16 *regated in a distinct subaccount to allow necessary compliance with the Internal Revenue Code*] **EOU**
17 **Field House Facility Fund, established under section 2 of this 2019 Act**, for distribution to
18 Eastern Oregon University to construct a new field house facility.

19 “(3) The Legislative Assembly finds that the use of lottery bond proceeds will create jobs, fur-
20 ther economic development, finance public education or restore and protect parks, beaches,
21 watersheds and native fish and wildlife, and is authorized based on the following findings:

22 “(a) A new facility is needed in order for the university to have adequate instructional and
23 athletic space.

24 “(b) Having adequate university buildings and facilities is essential to Oregon’s healthy eco-
25 nomic growth.

26 “(c) The field house facility will be used as a venue for regional events, providing significant
27 economic benefits to local communities.

28 “(d) Oregon manufactured wood products, including cross-laminated timber, will be utilized in
29 the construction of the field house facility, supporting Oregon’s wood products manufacturing in-
30 dustry.

31 “**SECTION 2.** (1) **The EOU Field House Facility Fund is established in the State Treasury,**
32 **separate and distinct from the General Fund. Interest earned on the moneys in the EOU**
33 **Field House Facility Fund must be credited to the fund. The fund consists of moneys depos-**
34 **ited in the fund under section 8, chapter 87, Oregon Laws 2018, and may include moneys ap-**
35 **propriated, allocated, deposited or transferred to the fund by the Legislative Assembly or**

1 otherwise and interest earned on moneys in the fund.

2 “(2) Moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the Higher Education Coordi-
3 nating Commission for the purposes specified in section 8, chapter 87, Oregon Laws 2018.

4 “**SECTION 3.** The Oregon Department of Administrative Services may expend up to
5 \$533,000 of net proceeds of lottery bonds issued pursuant to section 1, chapter 614, Oregon
6 Laws 2011, for distribution to the Cascade AIDS Project for the purposes described in section
7 12, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017.

8 “**SECTION 4.** Section 12, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

9 “**Sec. 12.** (1) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, at the request of the Oregon Department
10 of Administrative Services, after the department consults with the Cascade AIDS Project, the State
11 Treasurer is authorized to issue lottery bonds pursuant to ORS 286A.560 to 286A.585 in an amount
12 that produces, **together with the amount distributed by the department under section 3 of this**
13 **2019 Act, no more than** \$1 million in net proceeds and interest earnings for the purposes described
14 in subsection (2) of this section, plus an additional amount estimated by the State Treasurer to be
15 necessary to pay bond-related costs.

16 “(2) Net proceeds of lottery bonds issued under this section in an amount sufficient to provide
17 \$1 million in net proceeds and interest earnings must be transferred to the department for deposit
18 in the ODAS Economic Development Distributions Fund established under ORS 461.553 for distrib-
19 ution to the Cascade AIDS Project for acquisition and renovation of a primary care and mental
20 health center for the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and other minority gender identities
21 and sexual orientation community.

22 “(3) The Legislative Assembly finds that the use of lottery bond proceeds will create jobs, fur-
23 ther economic development, finance public education or restore and protect parks, beaches,
24 watersheds and native fish and wildlife, and is authorized based on the following findings:

25 “(a) Individuals increase their potential for self-sufficiency and use fewer public resources when
26 they have access to health care.

27 “(b) Individuals who have mental illnesses increase their potential for self-sufficiency and use
28 fewer public resources when they have access to mental health services.

29 “**SECTION 5.** Section 15, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

30 “**Sec. 15.** (1) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, at the request of the Oregon Department
31 of Administrative Services, after the department consults with the Family Nurturing Center [*Rogue*
32 *Valley Children’s Relief Nursery*], the State Treasurer is authorized to issue lottery bonds pursuant
33 to ORS 286A.560 to 286A.585 in an amount that produces \$2 million in net proceeds and interest
34 earnings for the purposes described in subsection (2) of this section, plus an additional amount es-
35 timated by the State Treasurer to be necessary to pay bond-related costs.

36 “(2) Net proceeds of lottery bonds issued under this section in an amount sufficient to provide
37 \$2 million in net proceeds and interest earnings must be transferred to the department for deposit
38 in the ODAS Economic Development Distributions Fund established under ORS 461.553 for distrib-
39 ution to the Family Nurturing Center [*Rogue Valley Children’s Relief Nursery to purchase and re-*
40 *habilitate affordable housing adjacent to the Family Nurturing Center Campus*] **to build or redevelop**
41 **affordable housing units serving seniors and families with young children.**

42 “(3) The Legislative Assembly finds that the use of lottery bond proceeds will create jobs, fur-
43 ther economic development, finance public education or restore and protect parks, beaches,
44 watersheds and native fish and wildlife, and is authorized based on the following findings:

45 “(a) Having housing for at-risk populations is essential to Oregon’s healthy economic growth.

1 “(b) A severe shortage of affordable housing exists in Oregon, and market indicators demon-
2 strate a growing gap between the supply of and demand for affordable housing.

3 “**SECTION 6.** Section 29, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

4 “**Sec. 29.** (1) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, at the request of the Oregon Department
5 of Administrative Services, after the department consults with the Oregon Business Development
6 Department, the State Treasurer is authorized to issue lottery bonds pursuant to ORS 286A.560 to
7 286A.585 in an amount that produces \$3,390,000 in net proceeds and interest earnings for the pur-
8 poses described in subsection (2) of this section, plus an additional amount estimated by the State
9 Treasurer to be necessary to pay bond-related costs.

10 “(2) Net proceeds of lottery bonds issued under this section in an amount sufficient to provide
11 \$3,390,000 in net proceeds and interest earnings must be transferred to the Oregon Business Devel-
12 opment Department for deposit in the American Manufacturing Innovation District Fund established
13 in section 7a, chapter 66, Oregon Laws 2016, for construction of [*access roads to the*] Oregon Man-
14 ufacturing Innovation Center [*Research and Development Facility and Training Center*] **access**
15 **roads.**

16 “(3) The Legislative Assembly finds that the use of lottery bonds proceeds with create jobs and
17 further economic development, and is authorized based on the finding that the Oregon Manufactur-
18 ing Innovation Center will enable and encourage the development of a robust manufacturing sector
19 in the Oregon economy.

20 “**SECTION 7.** Section 1, chapter 570, Oregon Laws 2017, as amended by section 1, chapter 87,
21 Oregon Laws 2018, is amended to read:

22 “**Sec. 1.** The amounts authorized, as provided by ORS 286A.035, for issuance of general obli-
23 gation bonds of the state during the 2017-2019 biennium, notwithstanding section 10, chapter 705,
24 Oregon Laws 2013, are as follows:

4 **“SECTION 9. Section 10, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017, is repealed.**

5 **“SECTION 10.** ORS 274.064 is amended to read:

6 “274.064. (1) The Portland Harbor Cleanup Fund is established in the State Treasury, separate
7 and distinct from the General Fund. **Interest earned by the Portland Harbor Cleanup Fund must**
8 **be credited to the fund.** The Portland Harbor Cleanup Fund consists of **all** moneys [*deposited in*
9 *the fund under section 10, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017,*] **credited to the fund** and may include
10 moneys appropriated, allocated, deposited or transferred to the fund by the Legislative Assembly or
11 otherwise and interest earned on moneys in the fund.

12 “(2) Moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the Department of State Lands for
13 [*disbursement for the purposes set forth in section 10, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017*] **costs relating**
14 **to or arising out of the Portland Harbor Superfund Site.**

15 “(3) Nothing in this section or [*section 10, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017,*] **any other law that**
16 **appropriates, allocates, deposits or transfers moneys to the fund** waives or limits the
17 department’s ability to recover, by way of insurance, cost recovery, contribution, or claim or action
18 relating to or arising out of the Portland Harbor Superfund Site, moneys from other parties, in-
19 cluding claims for costs incurred by the department. In no event shall anything in this section or
20 [*section 10, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017,*] **any other law that appropriates, allocates, deposits**
21 **or transfers moneys to the fund** be construed as a waiver by the State of Oregon of any form of
22 defense or immunity, whether sovereign immunity, governmental immunity, immunity based on the
23 Eleventh Amendment to the United States Constitution or otherwise.

24 **“SECTION 11. This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
25 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect**
26 **on its passage.”.**
