Senate Bill 748

Sponsored by Senator THOMSEN, Representatives GREENLICK, BYNUM

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Transportation, in conjunction with Oregon Health Authority, to provide to applicant for driver license written material regarding becoming bone marrow donor. Requires department to post signage regarding written material in all locations where driver license is issued. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to bone marrow; creating new provisions; amending ORS 431A.475; and prescribing an ef fective date.

4 Whereas the Legislative Assembly finds that every three minutes an American child or adult is 5 diagnosed with a potentially fatal blood disease; and

6 Whereas 20 to 34 percent of individuals with diverse heritage never find a bone marrow donor 7 match; and

8 Whereas for many individuals, bone marrow transplantation is the only chance for survival; and

9 Whereas the key to survivability lies in increasing the number of bone marrow donors across 10 all ethnicities, thus increasing the potential for a suitable match; and

11 Whereas the Legislative Assembly intends to increase awareness of the national bone marrow 12 donor program throughout this state and to increase the number of Oregonians on the national bone 13 marrow donor registry in order to increase the chance that all patients in need of bone marrow 14 transplants will find a suitable bone marrow match; now, therefore,

15 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

16 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) As used in this section, "driver license" has the meaning given that term
 17 in ORS 97.953.

(2) The Department of Transportation, in conjunction with the Oregon Health Authority,
 shall provide an applicant for a driver license with written materials regarding making a
 donation of bone marrow and being placed on a bone marrow donor registry or other list of
 potential bone marrow donors after the transaction related to the driver license is com pleted.

(3) The department, in consultation with a national bone marrow donation organization
 and other appropriate organizations, and in conjunction with the authority, shall place
 signage in each location where a driver license is issued. The signage must:

(a) Present information regarding the written materials provided under subsection (2) of
 this section.

(b) State that any of the applicant's personal information will be used solely for allowing
 the applicant to obtain information on becoming a possible bone marrow donor, and will not
 be used for commercial or fundraising purposes.

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1 (4) An organization or other third party may not use the information described in sub-2 section (3)(b) of this section for commercial or fundraising purposes.

3 (5) The department, in consultation with the authority, may adopt rules to carry out this
 4 section.

5 **SECTION 2.** ORS 431A.475 is amended to read:

6 431A.475. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall educate residents of this state about:

7 (a) The need for bone marrow donors;

8 (b) The procedures required to become registered as a potential bone marrow donor, including
9 procedures for determining a person's tissue type; [and]

(c) The medical procedures a donor must undergo to donate bone marrow or other sources of
 blood stem cells; and

(d) The ability to obtain information about bone marrow donation when applying for or
 renewing a driver license as defined in ORS 97.953.

(2) The Oregon Health Authority shall make special efforts to educate and recruit citizens of Oregon with a special emphasis on minority populations to volunteer as potential bone marrow donors. Means of communication may include use of press, radio and television, and placement of educational materials in appropriate health care facilities, blood banks and state and local agencies. The Oregon Health Authority in conjunction with the Department of Transportation shall make educational materials available at all places where driver licenses are issued or renewed.

20 <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) Section 1 of this 2019 Act and the amendments to ORS 431A.475 by sec-21 tion 2 of this 2019 Act become operative on January 1, 2020.

(2) The Department of Transportation and the Oregon Health Authority may take any action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the department and the authority to exercise, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the department and the authority by section 1 of this 2019 Act and the amendments to ORS 431A.475 by section 2 of this 2019 Act.

28 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2019 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2019 29 regular session of the Eightieth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
