

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 780

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “and” delete the rest of the line and insert “declaring an
2 emergency.”.

3 Delete lines 7 through 9 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:**

5 **“(a) ‘Cooperating agencies’ means the Oregon Health Authority, the Public Employees’**
6 **Benefit Board, the Oregon Educators Benefit Board and the Department of Consumer and**
7 **Business Services.**

8 **“(b) ‘Service region’ means Josephine County, Jackson County, Curry County and**
9 **southern Douglas County.**

10 **“(2) The cooperating agencies shall establish a pilot program to consolidate health in-**
11 **surance plans offered by the Public Employees’ Benefit Board, the Oregon Educators Benefit**
12 **Board and the state medical assistance program into one contract with distinct plan-specific**
13 **benefits. The cooperating agencies shall contract with one insurer to provide health insur-**
14 **ance to participants in health insurance plans offered by the Public Employees’ Benefit**
15 **Board, the Oregon Educators Benefit Board and the state medical assistance program in the**
16 **service region. The pilot program must feature:**

17 **“(a) A blended monthly payment applicable to participants in the health insurance plan**
18 **provided by the contracting insurer under the pilot program;**

19 **“(b) A global budget for hospital services offered to participants in the health insurance**
20 **plan provided by the contracting insurer under the pilot program;**

21 **“(c) A model in which the contracting insurer is responsible for an aligned care model**
22 **and payments to health care providers for participants in the health insurance plan provided**
23 **by the contracting insurer under the pilot program; and**

24 **“(d) A model in which participants in health insurance plans offered by the Public**
25 **Employees’ Benefit Board and the Oregon Educators Benefit Board are not required to par-**
26 **ticipate in the plan provided by the contracting insurer under the pilot program.**

27 **“(3) The Oregon Health Authority and the Department of Consumer and Business Ser-**
28 **vices shall adopt rules no later than October 1, 2019, to implement the pilot program no later**
29 **than October 1, 2020, including but not limited to rules relating to:**

30 **“(a) Contract procurement.**

31 **“(b) Benefit design.**

32 **“(c) Rate development.**

33 **“(d) Payment.**

34 **“(e) Quality metrics.**

35 **“(f) Reporting requirements.**

1 **“SECTION 3. The Oregon Health Authority and the Department of Consumer and Busi-**
2 **ness Services shall report on the pilot program established under section 2 of this 2019 Act**
3 **to a committee or interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to health care no**
4 **later than July 1 of 2021, 2023 and 2025. The report must include:**

5 **“(1) An analysis of reductions in the cost of care and the ability to comply with ORS**
6 **243.135 (8) and 243.866 (9).**

7 **“(2) An analysis of improvements in quality performance measures, care coordination,**
8 **case management and health outcomes.**

9 **“(3) Comparative data analysis illustrating performance of the pilot program in compar-**
10 **ison to the performance of health insurance plans offered by the Public Employees’ Benefit**
11 **Board, the Oregon Educators Benefit Board and the state medical assistance program at the**
12 **statewide and regional levels.**

13 **“SECTION 4. (1) Sections 1 and 2 of this 2019 Act are repealed on January 2, 2025.**

14 **“(2) Section 3 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2, 2026.**

15 **“SECTION 5. This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
16 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect**
17 **on its passage.”.**

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
