B-Engrossed Senate Bill 824

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Allows Oregon Board of Dentistry to accept results of national standardized examinations under specified circumstances when determining fitness of applicant to practice dentistry **or dental hy-giene**. Requires board to accept results from regional and national testing agencies for laboratory and clinical examinations under specified circumstances. Requires board, for certain applicants for licensure, to accept results of clinical board examinations from regional and national testing agencies.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

5	SECTION 1. ORS 679.070 is amended to read:
6	679.070. (1) The Oregon Board of Dentistry may administer written, laboratory or clinical ex-
7	aminations to test professional knowledge and skills.
8	(2) The examination [shall] must be elementary and practical in character but sufficiently
9	thorough to test the fitness of the applicant to practice dentistry. It [shall] must include, written
10	in the English language, questions on any subjects pertaining to dental science. [The written exam-
11	ination may be supplemented by oral examination. Demonstrations of the applicant's skill in operative
12	and prosthetic dentistry also may be required.]
13	[(3) The board may accept the results of national standardized examinations in satisfaction of the
14	written examination as authorized by this section, and shall accept the results of regional testing
15	agencies or of clinical board examinations administered by other states in satisfaction of the laboratory
16	or clinical examination authorized under this section, provided:]
17	[(a) The test or examination was taken within five years of the date of application; and]
18	[(b) The applicant received a passing score on the test or examination as established by the board
19	by rule.]
20	[(4) The board shall accept the results of regional testing agencies or of clinical board examinations
21	administered by other states in satisfaction of the examinations authorized under this section for ap-
22	plicants who have engaged in the active practice of dentistry in other states, in Oregon or in the Armed

(4) The board shall accept the results of regional and national testing agencies or of clinical board examinations administered by other states, and may accept results of boardrecognized testing agencies, in satisfaction of the examinations authorized under this section for applicants who have engaged in the active practice of dentistry in other states, in Oregon or in the Armed Forces of the United States, the United States Public Health Service or the United States Department of Veterans Affairs for at least 3,500 hours in the five years immediately preceding application and who meet all other requirements for licensure.

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SECTION 2. ORS 680.060 is amended to read:

680.060. (1) The Oregon Board of Dentistry may administer written, laboratory or clinical ex aminations to test professional knowledge and skills.

(2) The examination [shall] must be sufficiently thorough to test the fitness of the applicant to
practice dental hygiene. [It shall] The examination must include, written in the English language,
questions on any subjects pertaining to dental hygiene. [The written examination may be supplemented by oral examination. Demonstrations of the applicant's skill in clinical dental hygiene also
may be required.]

[(3) The board may accept the results of national standardized examinations in satisfaction of the written examination as authorized by this section, and shall accept the results of regional testing agencies or of clinical board examinations administered by other states in satisfaction of the clinical examination authorized under this section, provided:]

30 [(a) The test or examination was taken within five years of the date of application; and]

31 [(b) The applicant received a passing score on the test or examination as established by the board 32 by rule.]

(3) If a test or examination was taken within five years of the date of application and the
 applicant received a passing score on the test or examination, as established by the board
 by rule, the board:

(a) To satisfy the written examination authorized under this section, may accept the re sults of national standardized examinations.

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(b) To satisfy the clinical or laboratory examination authorized under this section:

(A) Shall accept the results of regional and national testing agencies or clinical board
 examinations administered by other states; and

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(B) May accept the results of board-recognized testing agencies.

42 (4) The board may accept results of board-recognized testing agencies and shall accept the 43 results of regional and national testing agencies or of clinical board examinations administered by 44 other states in satisfaction of the examinations authorized under this section for applicants who 45 have engaged in the active practice of dental hygiene in Oregon, other states, the Armed Forces of

2 Veterans Affairs for a period of at least 3,500 hours in the five years immediately preceding appli-

3 cation and who meet all other requirements for licensure.

SECTION 4. (1) The amendments to ORS 679.070 and 680.060 by sections 1 and 2 of this
2019 Act become operative on January 1, 2020.
