## Senate Bill 856

Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW, Representative PILUSO; Senator MANNING JR, Representative HERNANDEZ

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes Oregon Office of New Americans in Governor's office. Specifies duties.

<b>2</b>	Relating to services for immigrants in Oregon.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. The Oregon Office of New Americans is established in the office of the
5	Governor to serve as a central resource for welcoming and orienting immigrants coming to
6	Oregon and to coordinate government and nonprofit services available to new immigrants.
7	The Governor shall appoint no fewer than three individuals to carry out the responsibilities
8	of the Oregon Office of New Americans in performing the following functions:
9	(1) Connecting immigrants from diverse communities;
10	(2) Providing assistance to immigrants in accessing social services, legal assistance,
11	health care and local and federal government services;
12	(3) Maintaining shared community events calendars that are updated and translated into
13	the languages of each community;
14	(4) Being a resource to immigrants regarding:
15	(a) Educational opportunities;
16	(b) Employment;
17	(c) Legal assistance;
18	(d) Advocacy organizations;
19	(e) Training opportunities;
20	(f) Tutoring;
21	(g) Workshops and clinics;
22	(h) English as a second language classes; and
23	(i) Oregon History Day programs;
24	(5) Providing data and information to government agencies, social service agencies and
25	the public to better understand and meet the needs of immigrant communities and to dem-
26	onstrate the diversity of the population in this state;
27	(6) Compiling a database on:
28	(a) Migration and immigration numbers and patterns;
29	(b) Immigrants' countries of origin;
30	(c) Gaps in services provided to immigrants;
31	(d) Immigrant community needs; and
32	(e) Concerns of immigrant communities; and

(7) Compiling data regarding services available to immigrants, including community out reach activities.
<u>SECTION 2.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri ated to the office of the Governor, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General
Fund, the amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_, which may be expended for implementing and administering
the Oregon Office of New Americans established by section 1 of this 2019 Act.
