**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 558**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “810.180” insert “, 811.105 and
2 811.111”.

3 On page 4, after line 18, insert:

4 **“SECTION 2.** ORS 811.111 is amended to read:

5 “811.111. (1) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the
6 person:

7 “(a) Drives a vehicle on an interstate highway, except for the portions
8 of interstate highway described in subsection (2) of this section, at a speed
9 greater than 65 miles per hour or, if a different speed is posted under ORS
10 810.180, at a speed greater than the posted speed.

11 “(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection, drives any of the
12 following vehicles at a speed greater than 55 miles per hour on any highway,
13 except for the portions of highway described in subsections (2) to (12) of this
14 section, or, if a different speed is posted under ORS 810.180, at a speed
15 greater than the posted speed:

16 “(A) A motor truck with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 10,000
17 pounds or a truck tractor with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than
18 8,000 pounds.

19 “(B) A school bus.

20 “(C) A school activity vehicle.

21 “(D) A worker transport bus.

1 “(E) A bus operated for transporting children to and from church or an
2 activity or function authorized by a church.

3 “(F) Any vehicle used in the transportation of persons for hire by a
4 nonprofit entity.

5 “(c) Drives a vehicle or conveyance on any part of the ocean shore in this
6 state at a speed greater than any of the following:

7 “(A) Any designated speed for ocean shores that is established and posted
8 under ORS 810.180.

9 “(B) If no designated speed is posted under ORS 810.180, 25 miles per
10 hour.

11 “(d) **Except as otherwise provided in this section,** drives a vehicle
12 upon a highway [*in any city*] at a speed greater than a speed posted by au-
13 thority granted under ORS 810.180 or, if no designated speed is posted, the
14 following:

15 “(A) Fifteen miles per hour when driving on an alley or a narrow resi-
16 dential roadway.

17 “(B) Twenty miles per hour in a business district.

18 “(C) Twenty-five miles per hour in a public park.

19 “(D) Twenty-five miles per hour on a highway in a residence district if
20 the highway is not an arterial highway.

21 “(E) Sixty-five miles per hour on an interstate highway.

22 “(F) Fifty-five miles per hour in locations not otherwise described in this
23 paragraph.

24 “(e) Drives a vehicle in a school zone at a speed greater than 20 miles
25 per hour if the school zone is:

26 “(A) A segment of highway described in ORS 801.462 (1)(a) and:

27 “(i) The school zone has a flashing light used as a traffic control device
28 and operated as provided under ORS 810.243; or

29 “(ii) If the school zone does not have a flashing light used as a traffic
30 control device, the person drives in the school zone between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.

1 on a day when school is in session.

2 “(B) A crosswalk described in ORS 801.462 (1)(b) and:

3 “(i) A flashing light is used as a traffic control device and operated as
4 provided under ORS 810.243; or

5 “(ii) Children are present, as described in ORS 811.124.

6 “(2) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the person
7 drives a vehicle on the portion of Interstate 84 beginning at the eastern city
8 limit of The Dalles and ending at the Idaho state line at a speed greater
9 than:

10 “(a) Sixty-five miles per hour for vehicles described in subsection (1)(b)
11 of this section; or

12 “(b) Seventy miles per hour for all other vehicles.

13 “(3) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the person
14 drives a vehicle on the portion of State Highway 95 beginning at the Idaho
15 state line and ending at the Nevada state line at a speed greater than:

16 “(a) Sixty-five miles per hour for vehicles described in subsection (1)(b)
17 of this section; or

18 “(b) Seventy miles per hour for all other vehicles.

19 “(4) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the person
20 drives a vehicle on the portion of State Highway 20 beginning in Bend and
21 ending in Ontario at a speed greater than:

22 “(a) Sixty miles per hour for vehicles described in subsection (1)(b) of this
23 section; or

24 “(b) Sixty-five miles per hour for all other vehicles.

25 “(5) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the person
26 drives a vehicle on the portion of State Highway 197 beginning in The Dalles
27 and ending at its intersection with State Highway 97 and the portion of State
28 Highway 97 beginning at its intersection with State Highway 197 and ending
29 at the California state line at a speed greater than:

30 “(a) Sixty miles per hour for vehicles described in subsection (1)(b) of this

1 section; or

2 “(b) Sixty-five miles per hour for all other vehicles.

3 “(6) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the person
4 drives a vehicle on the portion of State Highway 31 beginning in Valley Falls
5 and ending in La Pine at a speed greater than:

6 “(a) Sixty miles per hour for vehicles described in subsection (1)(b) of this
7 section; or

8 “(b) Sixty-five miles per hour for all other vehicles.

9 “(7) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the person
10 drives a vehicle on the portion of State Highway 78 beginning in Burns
11 Junction and ending in Burns at a speed greater than:

12 “(a) Sixty miles per hour for vehicles described in subsection (1)(b) of this
13 section; or

14 “(b) Sixty-five miles per hour for all other vehicles.

15 “(8) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the person
16 drives a vehicle on the portion of State Highway 395 beginning in Burns and
17 ending in John Day at a speed greater than:

18 “(a) Sixty miles per hour for vehicles described in subsection (1)(b) of this
19 section; or

20 “(b) Sixty-five miles per hour for all other vehicles.

21 “(9) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the person
22 drives a vehicle on the portion of State Highway 395 beginning in Riley and
23 ending at the California state line at a speed greater than:

24 “(a) Sixty miles per hour for vehicles described in subsection (1)(b) of this
25 section; or

26 “(b) Sixty-five miles per hour for all other vehicles.

27 “(10) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the person
28 drives a vehicle on the portion of Oregon Route 205 beginning in Burns and
29 ending in Frenchglen at a speed greater than:

30 “(a) Sixty miles per hour for vehicles described in subsection (1)(b) of this

1 section; or

2 “(b) Sixty-five miles per hour for all other vehicles.

3 “(11) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the person
4 drives a vehicle on the portion of State Highway 26 beginning in John Day
5 and ending in Vale at a speed greater than:

6 “(a) Sixty miles per hour for vehicles described in subsection (1)(b) of this
7 section; or

8 “(b) Sixty-five miles per hour for all other vehicles.

9 “(12) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the person
10 drives a vehicle on the portion of Interstate 82 beginning at the Washington
11 state line and ending at its intersection with Interstate 84 at a speed greater
12 than:

13 “(a) Sixty-five miles per hour for vehicles described in subsection (1)(b)
14 of this section; or

15 “(b) Seventy miles per hour for all other vehicles.

16 “(13) The speed limits described in subsections (3) to (5) of this section
17 do not apply to portions of highways inside of a city in this state.

18 “(14) The offense described in this section, violating a speed limit, is
19 punishable as provided in ORS 811.109.

20 **“SECTION 3.** ORS 811.105 is amended to read:

21 “811.105. (1) Any speed in excess of a designated speed posted by authority
22 granted under ORS 810.180 is prima facie evidence of violation of the basic
23 speed rule under ORS 811.100.

24 “(2) If no designated speed is posted by authority granted under ORS
25 810.180, any speed in excess of one of the following speeds is prima facie
26 evidence of violation of the basic speed rule:

27 “(a) Fifteen miles per hour when driving on an alley or a narrow resi-
28 dential roadway.

29 “(b) Twenty miles per hour in a business district.

30 “(c) Twenty-five miles per hour in any public park.

1 “(d) Twenty-five miles per hour on a highway in a residence district if:
2 “(A) The residence district is not located within a city; and
3 “(B) The highway is [*neither*] **not** an arterial [*nor a collector*] highway.
4 “(e) Fifty-five miles per hour in locations not otherwise described in this
5 section.”.
