## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 378

- On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after "examinations" delete the rest of the line and insert a period.
- Delete lines 4 through 27 and delete page 2 and insert:
- "SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission, in collaboration with Disability Rights Oregon and the Oregon Health Au-
- 6 thority, shall conduct a study identifying barriers to the timely:
- 7 "(a) Completion of accurate and reliable fitness to proceed evalu-8 ations; and
- "(b) Commitment or other admission of defendants for inpatient fitness to proceed evaluations under ORS 161.365 or 161.370, or other law.
  - "(2) The commission shall present the results of the study, along with any recommended legislative changes, in a report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2021. The report must include results specific to each county and must be made accessible to the public.
- "(3) All agencies of state government are directed to assist the commission in the performance of the study and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice that the commission considers necessary to perform the study.

"SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-1 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Criminal Justice Commis-2 sion, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, 3 the amount of \$50,000, to be provided to Disability Rights Oregon for 4 the purposes of carrying out the provisions of section 1 of this 2019 5 Act. 6 "SECTION 3. Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2, 7 **2022.**". 8
