## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2206

- Delete lines 4 through 7 of the printed bill and insert:
- "SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, 'emergency' has the meaning given that term in ORS 401.025.
- "(2) The Department of Consumer and Business Services shall develop and administer a statewide program, as described in this section, to evaluate the condition of buildings after an emergency and determine whether the buildings may be safely occupied.
- 8 "(3) Under the program:

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- 9 "(a) The department shall develop standards and procedures for 10 training and certifying building evaluators.
- "(b) The department shall develop standards and procedures for determining whether buildings may be safely occupied after an emergency.
- "(c) The department shall develop plans for evaluating buildings following an emergency in a manner that maximizes public health and safety.
- "(d) The department shall work with local governments to designate local program coordinators who are responsible for implementing the program at the local government level, including authorizing building evaluators to perform work on behalf of the local government.
  - "(e) The department shall provide oversight of trainers, evaluators

- and local program coordinators. 1
- "(f) The department may authorize local governments to create lo-2 cal programs under which building owners, prior to an emergency, 3 may contract with private building evaluators to conduct building 4 evaluations following an emergency.
  - "(g) The department may enter into agreements with other states to provide mutual aid, which may include reciprocal recognition of certifications for skills related to building evaluation.
  - "(4) In developing and implementing the program, the department shall consult with:
    - "(a) Local governments;
  - "(b) Relevant state agencies or offices, including the Office of **Emergency Management**; and
  - "(c) Relevant professional organizations, including organizations representing architects, engineers and building safety professionals.
  - "(5) The department shall adopt rules to administer and implement the provisions of this section.".

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
