## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2415

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, delete "279C.560," and after 2 "279C.570" delete the comma and insert "and".

3 In line 3, after "701.420" insert a period and delete the rest of the line.

4 Delete lines 5 through 22 and delete pages 2 through 8 and insert:

5 "SECTION 1. ORS 279C.570 is amended to read:

"279C.570. (1) It is the policy of the State of Oregon that all payments due
on a public improvement contract and owed by a contracting agency shall
be paid promptly. No contracting agency is exempt from the provisions of
this section.

10 "(2) Contracting agencies shall make progress payments on the contract monthly as work progresses on a public improvement contract. Payments 11 shall be based upon estimates of work completed that are approved by the 12 contracting agency. A progress payment is not considered acceptance or ap-13 proval of any work or waiver of any defects therein. The contracting agency 14 shall pay to the contractor interest on the progress payment, not including 15retainage, due the contractor. The interest shall commence 30 days after re-16 ceipt of the invoice from the contractor or 15 days after the payment is ap-17 proved by the contracting agency, whichever is the earlier date. The rate of 18 interest charged to the contracting agency on the amount due shall equal 19 three times the discount rate on 90-day commercial paper in effect at the 20Federal Reserve Bank in the Federal Reserve district that includes Oregon 21

on the date that is 30 days after receipt of the invoice from the contractor 1 or 15 days after the payment is approved by the contracting agency, which- $\mathbf{2}$ ever is the earlier date, but the rate of interest may not exceed 30 percent. 3 If the contract price exceeds \$250,000, the contracting agency shall 4 place amounts deducted as retainage into an interest-bearing escrow  $\mathbf{5}$ account. Interest on the retainage amount accrues from the date the 6 payment request is approved until the date the retainage is paid to the 7 contractor to which it is due. 8

9 "(3) Interest shall be paid automatically when payments become overdue. 10 The contracting agency shall document, calculate and pay any interest due 11 when payment is made on the principal. Interest payments shall accompany 12 payment of net due on public improvement contracts. The contracting agency 13 may not require the contractor to petition, invoice, bill or wait additional 14 days to receive interest due.

"(4) When an invoice is filled out incorrectly, when there is any defect 15 or impropriety in any submitted invoice or when there is a good faith dis-16 pute, the contracting agency shall so notify the contractor within 15 days 17 stating the reason or reasons the invoice is defective or improper or the 18 reasons for the dispute. A defective or improper invoice, if corrected by the 19 contractor within seven days of being notified by the contracting agency, 20may not cause a payment to be made later than specified in this section 21unless interest is also paid. 22

"(5) If requested in writing by a first-tier subcontractor, the contractor, within 10 days after receiving the request, shall send to the first-tier subcontractor a copy of that portion of any invoice, request for payment submitted to the contracting agency or pay document provided by the contracting agency to the contractor specifically related to any labor or materials supplied by the first-tier subcontractor.

"(6) Payment of interest may be postponed when payment on the principal
is delayed because of disagreement between the contracting agency and the

contractor. Whenever a contractor brings formal administrative or judicial
action to collect interest due under this section, the prevailing party is entitled to costs and reasonable attorney fees.

"(7) A contracting agency may reserve as retainage from any progress 4 payment on a public improvement contract an amount not to exceed five  $\mathbf{5}$ percent of the payment. As work progresses, a contracting agency may re-6 duce the amount of the retainage and the contracting agency may eliminate 7 retainage on any remaining monthly contract payments after 50 percent of 8 the work under the contract is completed if, in the contracting agency's 9 opinion, such work is progressing satisfactorily. Elimination or reduction of 10 retainage shall be allowed only upon written application by the contractor, 11 and the application shall include written approval of the contractor's surety. 12 However, when the contract work is 97.5 percent completed the contracting 13 agency may, at the contracting agency's discretion and without application 14 by the contractor, reduce the retained amount to 100 percent of the value 15 of the contract work remaining to be done. Upon receipt of a written appli-16 cation by the contractor, the contracting agency shall respond in writing 17 within a reasonable time. 18

"(8) The retainage held by a contracting agency shall be included in and 19 paid to the contractor as part of the final payment of the contract price. The 20contracting agency shall pay to the contractor interest at the rate of 1.5 21percent per month on the final payment due the contractor, interest to 22commence 30 days after the work under the contract has been completed and 23accepted and to run until the date when the final payment is tendered to the 24contractor. The contractor shall notify the contracting agency in writing 25when the contractor considers the work complete and the contracting agency 26shall, within 15 days after receiving the written notice, either accept the 27work or notify the contractor of work yet to be performed on the contract. 28If the contracting agency does not, within the time allowed, notify the con-29 tractor of work yet to be performed to fulfill contractual obligations, the 30

end of the 15-day period.

"(9)(a) The contracting agency shall pay, upon settlement or judgment in 3 favor of the contractor regarding any dispute as to the compensation due a 4 contractor for work performed under the terms of a public improvement  $\mathbf{5}$ contract, the amount due plus interest at the rate of two times the discount 6 rate, but not to exceed 30 percent, on 90-day commercial paper in effect at 7 the Federal Reserve Bank in the Federal Reserve district that includes 8 Oregon on the date of the settlement or judgment, and accruing from the 9 later of: 10

11 "(A) The due date of any progress payment received under the contract 12 for the period in which such work was performed; or

"(B) Thirty days after the date on which the claim for the payment under
 dispute was presented to the contracting agency by the contractor in writing
 or in accordance with applicable provisions of the contract.

"(b) Interest shall be added to and not made a part of the settlement orjudgment.

18 "SECTION 2. ORS 701.420 is amended to read:

"701.420. (1) Partial payment is allowed and may be made on contracts for construction and home improvement. An owner, contractor or subcontractor may withhold as retainage an amount equal to not more than five percent of the contract price of the work completed. Partial payment allowed under this subsection is not acceptance or approval of some of the work or a waiver of defects in the work.

<sup>25</sup> "(2)(a) The owner, contractor or subcontractor shall pay interest at the <sup>26</sup> rate of one percent per month on the final payment due the contractor or <sup>27</sup> subcontractor. The interest shall commence 30 days after the contractor or <sup>28</sup> subcontractor has completed and the owner has accepted the work under the <sup>29</sup> contract for construction for which the final payment is due. The interest <sup>30</sup> shall run until the date when final payment is tendered to the contractor or

subcontractor. When the contractor or subcontractor considers the work that 1 the contractor or subcontractor is contracted to perform to be complete, the  $\mathbf{2}$ contractor or subcontractor shall notify the party to whom the contractor 3 or subcontractor is responsible for performing the construction work under 4 the contract. The party shall, within 15 days after receiving the notice, ei- $\mathbf{5}$ ther accept the work or notify the contractor or subcontractor of work yet 6 to be performed under the contract. If the party does not accept the work 7 or does not notify the contractor or subcontractor of work yet to be per-8 formed within the time allowed, the interest required under this subsection 9 shall commence 30 days after the end of the 15-day period. 10

"(b) If the contract price exceeds \$250,000, the owner, contractor or subcontractor shall place amounts withheld as retainage into an interest-bearing escrow account. Interest on the retainage amount accrues from the date the payment request is approved until the date the retainage is paid to the contractor or subcontractor to which it is due.

"(3) When a contractor pays a subcontractor in full, including the amount 17 the contractor withheld as retainage, the owner with whom the contractor 18 has the contract shall pay the contractor, out of the amount that the owner 19 withheld from the contractor as retainage, a sum equal to the amount of 20retainage that the contractor paid the subcontractor. The contractor shall 21notify the owner when the contractor pays a subcontractor in full under this 22section and the owner shall, within 15 days after receiving the notice, pay 23the contractor the amount due the contractor under this subsection. Interest 24on the amount due the contractor at the rate of one percent per month shall 2526 commence 30 days after the owner receives notice of full payment to the subcontractor. 27

"<u>SECTION 3.</u> The amendments to ORS 279C.570 and 701.420 by
 sections 1 and 2 of this 2019 Act apply to contracts entered into on or
 after the effective date of this 2019 Act.".

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
