**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 378**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “examinations” delete the rest
2 of the line and insert a period.

3 Delete lines 4 through 27 and delete page 2 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission, in col-**
5 **laboration with Disability Rights Oregon, the Oregon Health Authority**
6 **and the Judicial Department, shall conduct a study identifying barriers**
7 **to the timely:**

8 **“(a) Completion of accurate and reliable inpatient, outpatient and**
9 **privately obtained fitness to proceed evaluations under ORS 161.365 or**
10 **161.370; and**

11 **“(b) Admission of defendants for inpatient fitness to proceed eval-**
12 **uations following an order of commitment under ORS 161.365 or**
13 **161.370.**

14 **“(2) The commission shall present the results of the study, along**
15 **with any recommended legislative changes, in a report to the interim**
16 **committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary in the**
17 **manner provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2021.**
18 **The report must include results specific to each county and must be**
19 **made accessible to the public.**

20 **“(3) All agencies of state government are directed to assist the**
21 **commission in the performance of the study and, to the extent per-**

1 **mitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and**
2 **advice that the commission considers necessary to perform the study.**

3 **“SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-**
4 **ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Criminal Justice Commis-**
5 **sion, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund,**
6 **the amount of \$50,000, to be provided to Disability Rights Oregon for**
7 **the purposes of carrying out the provisions of section 1 of this 2019**
8 **Act.**

9 **“SECTION 3. Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2,**
10 **2022.”.**
