**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 3182**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 28 and delete page
2 2 and insert:

3 **“SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2019 Act is added to and made a part**
4 **of ORS 454.605 to 454.755.**

5 **“SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:**

6 **“(a) ‘Alternate water source’ means a source of water other than**
7 **a source of potable water as identified by the Environmental Quality**
8 **Commission by rule.**

9 **“(b) ‘Nonpotable end use’ means the use of nonpotable water for**
10 **toilet or urinal supply water, clothes washing, irrigation, mechanical**
11 **cooling, p-trap priming, dust suppression or any other use authorized**
12 **by the commission by rule.**

13 **“(c) ‘Onsite nonpotable water’ means water that has been collected**
14 **from an alternate water source and treated such that the water is**
15 **suitable for direct beneficial use.**

16 **“(d) ‘Onsite nonpotable water system’ means a system for the col-**
17 **lection of water from alternate water sources within or surrounding**
18 **a building, the treatment of the water into onsite nonpotable water**
19 **and the use of the resulting onsite nonpotable water for nonpotable**
20 **end uses onsite or in a local area.**

21 **“(2)(a) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, a person**

1 may not construct, install or operate an onsite nonpotable water sys-
2 tem without first obtaining a permit from the Department of Envi-
3 ronmental Quality.

4 “(b) An onsite nonpotable water system for which a permit has been
5 issued under this section is exempt from the requirements of ORS
6 454.610 and 454.655.

7 “(3) A person who constructs, installs or operates a gray water re-
8 use and disposal system that meets the requirements adopted by rule
9 under subsection (4) of this section for an onsite nonpotable water
10 system may choose to obtain a permit under either this section or ORS
11 454.610.

12 “(4) The Environmental Quality Commission, in consultation with
13 the Building Codes Division of the Department of Consumer and
14 Business Services, shall adopt rules to implement the provisions of
15 this section. Rules adopted by the commission must include risk-based
16 water quality standards for onsite nonpotable water systems. In
17 adopting rules under this subsection, the commission shall address,
18 at a minimum:

19 “(a) Risk-based log reduction targets for the removal of pathogens
20 such as enteric viruses, parasitic protozoa and enteric bacteria from
21 water collected from alternate water sources, such that the resulting
22 onsite nonpotable water may be safely reused for nonpotable end uses;

23 “(b) Water quality monitoring requirements;

24 “(c) Reporting requirements related to water quality monitoring
25 results;

26 “(d) Notification and public information requirements;

27 “(e) Cross-connection controls; and

28 “(f) Permit requirements.

29 **“SECTION 3. (1) Section 2 of this 2019 Act becomes operative on**
30 **January 1, 2020.**

1 **“(2) The Environmental Quality Commission may adopt rules or**
2 **take any actions before the operative date specified in subsection (1)**
3 **of this section that are necessary to enable the commission and the**
4 **Department of Environmental Quality, on and after the operative date**
5 **specified in subsection (1) of this section, to carry out the provisions**
6 **of section 2 of this 2019 Act. Rules adopted pursuant to this section**
7 **may not become operative before January 1, 2020.**

8 **“SECTION 4. This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate**
9 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
10 **declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
