## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2916

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, delete "446.003,".

2 Delete lines 5 through 30 and delete pages 2 through 4.

3 On page 5, delete lines 1 through 31 and insert:

4 **"SECTION 1.** ORS 446.265 is amended to read:

"446.265. (1) Inside an urban growth boundary, a [municipality] local 5 government may [approve] authorize the establishment of [a campground] 6 inside an urban growth boundary to be used for providing transitional housing 7 accommodations. The accommodations may consist of separate facilities, in the 8 form of yurts, for use] transitional housing accommodations used as in-9 **dividual** living units by one or more individuals [or by families. The person 10 establishing the accommodations may provide access to water, toilet, shower, 11 laundry, cooking, telephone or other services either through separate or shared 12 facilities. The accommodations shall provide parking facilities and 13walkways]. 14

<sup>15</sup> "[(2)] **Use of** transitional housing accommodations [described under sub-<sup>16</sup> section (1) of this section shall be] is limited to persons who lack permanent <sup>17</sup> or safe shelter and who cannot be placed in other low income housing. A <sup>18</sup> [municipality] local government may limit the maximum amount of time <sup>19</sup> that an individual or a family may use the accommodations.

20 "[(3)] (2) [Campgrounds providing transitional housing accommodations 21 described under this section may be operated by private persons or nonprofit

organizations. The shared facilities of the campgrounds are subject to regu-1 lation under the recreation park specialty code described under ORS 446.310  $\mathbf{2}$ to 446.350.] Transitional housing accommodations are intended to be 3 used by individuals or families on a limited basis for seasonal, emer-4 gency or transitional housing purposes and may include yurts, huts,  $\mathbf{5}$ cabins, fabric structures, tents and similar accommodations. The 6 transitional housing accommodations may provide parking facilities, 7 walkways and access to water, toilet, shower, laundry, cooking, tele-8 phone or other services either through separate or shared facilities. 9 The Oregon Health Authority may develop public health best practices 10 for shared health and sanitation facilities for transitional housing ac-11 commodations. 12

"(3) [*The*] Transitional housing accommodations are not subject to ORS
chapter 90.

<sup>15</sup> "[(4) To the extent deemed relevant by The Department of Consumer and <sup>16</sup> Business Services, the construction and installation of yurts on campgrounds <sup>17</sup> used for providing transitional housing accommodations established under this <sup>18</sup> section is subject to the manufactured structures specialty code described in <sup>19</sup> ORS 446.155. Transitional housing accommodations not appurtenant to a yurt <sup>20</sup> are subject to regulation as provided under subsection (3) of this section.]

"[(5) Campgrounds established for providing transitional housing accommodations shall not be allowed on more than two parcels in a municipality. In approving the use of parcels for a campground, the municipality shall give preference to locations that have access to grocery stores and public transit services.]

"[(6)] (4) As used in this section, 'yurt' means a round, domed tent of canvas or other weather resistant material, having a rigid framework, wooden floor, one or more windows or skylights and that may have plumbing, electrical service or heat.

## <sup>30</sup> "SECTION 2. ORS 446.325 is amended to read:

"446.325. (1) [Public entities, private persons or nonprofit organizations 1 described] A person operating a campground for transitional housing  $\mathbf{2}$ accommodations under ORS 446.265 [(3)], timber companies and private 3 utilities [shall] may not establish or operate a recreation park without 4 complying with the rules of the Oregon Health Authority and securing the 5 approval of the Director of the Oregon Health Authority or designee but 6 [shall be] are exempt from the licensing requirement of ORS 446.320. The 7 director or designee may delegate, to a health official having sufficient en-8 vironmental health specialists, the authority to approve such recreation 9 parks. 10

11 "(2) ORS 446.310 to 446.350 do not apply to:

"(a) Any structure designed for and occupied as a single family residence in which no more than two sleeping rooms are provided on a daily or weekly basis for the use of no more than a total of six travelers or transients at any one time for a charge or fee paid or to be paid for the rental or use of the facilities;

"(b) Any temporary camping sites used solely and incidentally in the course of backpacking, hiking, horseback packing, canoeing, rafting or other expedition, unless the expedition is part of an organizational camp program; or

"(c) [A yurt, as defined in ORS 446.265, that is used as a living unit in transitional housing accommodations] **Transitional housing accommo**dations.".

In line 32, delete "4" and insert "3".

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
