- 8 "SECTION 3. If the amendments to ORS 187.110 by section 1 of this
- 9 2019 Act have not become operative by December 1, 2029, section 2 of
- this 2019 Act is repealed on December 1, 2029.
- "SECTION 4. If section 2 of this 2019 Act is repealed by section 3 of this
- 12 2019 Act, on December 1, 2029, ORS 187.110, as amended by section 1 of this
- 13 2019 Act, is amended to read:
- "187.110. (1) The standard of time for the State of Oregon shall be [one
