**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 320**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “provisions;” delete the rest of the line
2 and line 3 and insert “and amending ORS 187.110.”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 18 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 187.110 is amended to read:

5 “187.110. (1) The standard of time for the State of Oregon shall be **one**
6 **hour in advance of** the United States standard of time as established by the
7 Congress of the United States for any particular area of the state under 15
8 U.S.C. 261, except that: [*from 2 a.m. on the second Sunday in March until*
9 *2 a.m. on the first Sunday in November the standard of time for any area of*
10 *this state shall be one hour in advance of the standard established for that*
11 *particular area by the Congress of the United States under 15 U.S.C. 261.*]

12 **“(a) The standard of time for that portion of the State of Oregon**
13 **that is in the Mountain Time Zone shall be the United States standard**
14 **of time as established by the Congress of the United States for that**
15 **area under 15 U.S.C. 261; and**

16 **“(b) From 2 a.m. on the second Sunday in March until 2 a.m. on**
17 **the first Sunday in November the standard of time for that portion**
18 **of the State of Oregon that is in the Mountain Time Zone shall be one**
19 **hour in advance of the standard established for that area by the Con-**
20 **gress of the United States under 15 U.S.C. 261.**

21 **“(2) No department of the state government and no county, city or other**

1 political subdivision shall employ any other time or adopt any statute, ordi-
2 nance or order providing for the use of any other standard of time.

3 **“SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 187.110 by section 1 of this**
4 **2019 Act become operative at 2 a.m. on the first Sunday of the first**
5 **November in which the standard of time in the States of California**
6 **and Washington is one hour in advance of the United States standard**
7 **of time for California and Washington.**

8 **“SECTION 3. If the amendments to ORS 187.110 by section 1 of this**
9 **2019 Act have not become operative by December 1, 2029, section 2 of**
10 **this 2019 Act is repealed on December 1, 2029.**

11 **“SECTION 4. If section 2 of this 2019 Act is repealed by section 3 of this**
12 **2019 Act, on December 1, 2029, ORS 187.110, as amended by section 1 of this**
13 **2019 Act, is amended to read:**

14 **“187.110. (1) The standard of time for the State of Oregon shall be [one**
15 **hour in advance of] the United States standard of time as established by the**
16 **Congress of the United States for any particular area of the state under 15**
17 **U.S.C. 261, except that[:]** **from 2 a.m. on the second Sunday in March**
18 **until 2 a.m. on the first Sunday in November the standard of time for**
19 **any area of this state shall be one hour in advance of the standard**
20 **established for that particular area by the Congress of the United**
21 **States under 15 U.S.C. 261.**

22 **“[(a) The standard of time for that portion of the State of Oregon that is**
23 **in the Mountain Time Zone shall be the United States standard of time as**
24 **established by the Congress of the United States for that area under 15 U.S.C.**
25 **261; and]**

26 **“[(b) From 2 a.m. on the second Sunday in March until 2 a.m. on the first**
27 **Sunday in November the standard of time for that portion of the State of**
28 **Oregon that is in the Mountain Time Zone shall be one hour in advance of the**
29 **standard established for that area by the Congress of the United States under**
30 **15 U.S.C. 261.]**

1 “(2) No department of the state government and no county, city or other
2 political subdivision shall employ any other time or adopt any statute, ordi-
3 nance or order providing for the use of any other standard of time.”.
