**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
SENATE BILL 786**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 31.

2 On page 2, delete line 1 and insert:

3 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 336.059 is amended to read:

4 “336.059. (1) Each school district board shall adopt a child sexual abuse  
5 **and sex trafficking** prevention instructional program for students in  
6 kindergarten through grade 12.

7 “(2) School districts must include in the program:

8 “(a) Developmentally appropriate, culturally sensitive and evidence-based  
9 instruction for each grade level;

10 “(b) A minimum of four instructional sessions per school year, with each  
11 year’s instruction building on the previous year’s instruction;

12 “(c) Age-appropriate curriculum [*including role-playing, discussion, activ-*  
13 *ities and books to educate students*] regarding child sexual abuse  
14 [*prevention;*] **and sex trafficking prevention that includes:**

15 **“(A) Role-playing, discussion, activities and books; and**

16 **“(B) For sex trafficking prevention, information about the preva-**  
17 **lence and nature of sex trafficking, strategies to reduce the risk of sex**  
18 **and familial trafficking, strategies to reduce the risk of peer recruit-**  
19 **ment and online solicitation, techniques to set healthy boundaries and**  
20 **methods for safely seeking assistance;**

21 “(d) Instruction providing students with the knowledge and tools to com-

1 municate incidents of sexual abuse **and sex trafficking**;

2 “(e) Instruction regarding ‘safe touch,’ ‘unsafe touch,’ ‘safe secrets,’ ‘un-  
3 safe secrets,’ and how to escape and report a sexual abuse **or sex trafficking**  
4 situation;

5 “(f) Techniques to recognize child sexual abuse **or sex trafficking**, skills  
6 to reduce vulnerability and encouragement to report child sexual abuse **and**  
7 **sex trafficking**;

8 “(g) An evaluation component with measurable outcomes;

9 “(h) A professional training component for administrators, teachers and  
10 other school personnel regarding communicating child sexual abuse **and sex**  
11 **trafficking** prevention techniques to students, effects of child sexual abuse  
12 **and sex trafficking** on children, receiving child sexual abuse **and sex**  
13 **trafficking** reports and disclosures and mandated reporting; and

14 “(i) A parental involvement component to inform parents about child  
15 sexual abuse **and sex trafficking** topics, including characteristics of  
16 offenders **and traffickers**, ‘grooming’ behaviors and how to discuss child  
17 sexual abuse **and sex trafficking** prevention with children.

18 **“(3) Information provided in subsection (2) of this section related**  
19 **to the reporting of sex trafficking shall incorporate efforts to coordi-**  
20 **nate counties, local agencies and other stakeholders through agreed-**  
21 **upon protocols for reporting child sex trafficking.**

22 “[3] (4) Program instruction may be delivered by instructors including  
23 teachers, school counselors and outside agency prevention educators, pro-  
24 vided the instructors have knowledge of and training in child sexual abuse  
25 **and sex trafficking** prevention.”.

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
