**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2816**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “management;” insert “creating
2 new provisions; amending ORS 634.657;”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 29 and delete page 2 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 634.657 is amended to read:

5 “634.657. (1) There is established an Integrated Pest Management Coordi-
6 nating Committee, consisting of:

7 “(a) The State Integrated Pest Management Coordinator;

8 “(b) The integrated pest management coordinator for each state agency
9 listed in ORS 634.660;

10 “(c) A representative of public universities listed in ORS 352.002, ap-
11 pointed by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission; and

12 “(d) The integrated pest management coordinator for each public univer-
13 sity listed in ORS 352.002.

14 “(2) The State Integrated Pest Management Coordinator shall chair the
15 committee. The committee may elect a vice chair. The committee may assign
16 duties to the chair and vice chair and provide them with the powers neces-
17 sary to perform those duties.

18 “(3) A majority of the committee members is a quorum for the purpose
19 of conducting business. Action by the committee requires approval by a ma-
20 jority of the committee members.

21 “(4) The committee shall meet three times per year at the call of the chair

1 for the purposes of:

2 “(a) Sharing information concerning the latest methods and approaches
3 to integrated pest management used to reduce the risks posed by pests and
4 concerning strategies related to pest management;

5 “(b) Sharing information concerning program successes and knowledge
6 gained in the implementation of integrated pest management programs;

7 “(c) Developing an adaptive management approach to the improvement
8 of integrated pest management by state agencies and public universities;

9 “(d) Identifying issues regarding risk reduction and evolving innovative
10 approaches to addressing the issues;

11 “(e) Reporting on, and developing a set of performance metrics to ade-
12 quately describe **and track**, state agency and public university progress in
13 implementing integrated pest management;

14 “(f) Sharing information concerning the integrated pest management pro-
15 grams of each state agency or public university in order to foster information
16 exchange concerning the latest technological advances and protocols and to
17 promote a consistent format for the programs;

18 “(g) Achieving reductions in risks from pests and from strategies relating
19 to pest management; and

20 “(h) Evaluating the need for notification of pesticide use and the policies
21 for notification as part of state agency and public university integrated pest
22 management programs.

23 “**(5) The committee shall make available to the public the date,**
24 **agenda and minutes for each meeting described under subsection (4)**
25 **of this section. The committee shall inform the public on the manner**
26 **in which a member of the public may submit to the committee feed-**
27 **back or input on agenda items.**

28 “[5] **(6)** In addition to the meetings required under subsection (4) of this
29 section, the committee may convene as the committee deems appropriate for
30 the purpose of coordinating state integrated pest management efforts with

1 the work of the Invasive Species Council. The committee and the council
2 shall jointly address the technical and management approach challenges
3 shared by programs to reduce risks from pests and reduce threats from
4 invasive species.

5 “[6] (7) The committee may identify threats of common interest to the
6 committee and the council, determine the resources needed for addressing the
7 threats and provide the information to state agencies and public universities.

8 “[7] (8) The committee shall prepare a biennial report to an interim
9 committee of the Legislative Assembly relating to pest management matters.
10 The report shall describe the status of state agency and public university
11 integrated pest management programs. The committee shall biennially pro-
12 vide an opportunity for public comment and input for the report **through a**
13 **website maintained by or on behalf of the committee for not less than**
14 **60 days prior to the date on which the committee will submit the re-**
15 **port to the interim committee.** The report on the state agency and public
16 university integrated pest management programs shall include, but need not
17 be limited to:

18 “(a) A description of the meetings, if any, between the State Integrated
19 Pest Management Coordinator and state agencies or public universities;

20 “(b) A description of the meetings of the committee;

21 “(c) A description of advances, innovations and training activities in
22 methodologies for reducing risks from pests;

23 “(d) A description of key problem matters, the approaches taken to ad-
24 dress the matters and concerns remaining outstanding;

25 “(e) Performance metric results for the implementation of integrated pest
26 management, including but not limited to state agency and public university
27 progress toward the goal of protecting the economy, ecosystems and water
28 quality of this state and protecting the health and welfare of children, the
29 elderly and other members of the public;

30 “(f) The integrated pest management program status of each state agency

1 and public university that uses state-owned or leased property;

2 “(g) Examples of cost-savings and expenditures resulting from integrated
3 pest management program implementation; and

4 “(h) Any recommendations for integrated pest management program im-
5 provements, including but not limited to any proposals for revising the defi-
6 nition of ‘integrated pest management.’

7 “[~~(8)(a)~~] **(9)(a)** The committee may seek funding from public or private
8 sources to enable the committee to develop pest risk and integrated pest
9 management metrics or to develop new technologies, strategies and ap-
10 proaches for addressing specific pest threats. Unless restricted by the donor,
11 the committee may use moneys donated under this subsection for any purpose
12 described in this subsection.

13 “(b) The [*State Department of Agriculture*] **Higher Education Coordi-**
14 **nating Commission** may accept funds donated under this subsection on be-
15 half of the committee. The moneys shall be credited to [*a subaccount within*
16 *the Department of Agriculture Service Fund and, notwithstanding ORS*
17 *561.144 and 634.326,*] **the Integrated Pest Management Fund established**
18 **under section 2 of this 2019 Act and** shall be dedicated for funding activ-
19 ities of the committee. The [*Director of Agriculture*] **commission** shall draw
20 warrants for the issuance of payments from the account as authorized by
21 vote of a majority of the committee.

22 “**SECTION 2. The Integrated Pest Management Fund is established**
23 **in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund.**
24 **Interest earned by the Integrated Pest Management Fund shall be**
25 **credited to the fund. Moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated**
26 **to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission and shall be used**
27 **for the purposes specified in ORS 634.657.**

28 “**SECTION 3. Any moneys remaining in the subaccount specified in**
29 **ORS 634.657 (8)(b) (2017 Edition) on the operative date of section 2 of**
30 **this 2019 Act shall be transferred, on the operative date of section 2**

1 of this 2019 Act, to the Integrated Pest Management Fund established
2 by section 2 of this 2019 Act for the purposes specified in ORS 634.657.

3 **“SECTION 4. (1) Section 2 of this 2019 Act and the amendments to**
4 **ORS 634.657 by section 1 of this 2019 Act become operative on January**
5 **1, 2020.**

6 **“(2) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission and the Inte-**
7 **grated Pest Management Coordinating Committee may take any action**
8 **before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that**
9 **is necessary to enable the commission and the committee to exercise,**
10 **on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this sec-**
11 **tion, all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the com-**
12 **mission and the committee by section 2 of this 2019 Act and the**
13 **amendments to ORS 634.657 by section 1 of this 2019 Act.**

14 **“SECTION 5. This 2019 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the**
15 **date on which the 2019 regular session of the Eightieth Legislative**
16 **Assembly adjourns sine die.”.**
