**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2181**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “development” insert “; and declaring
2 an emergency”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 12 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Maritime Sector Workforce
5 Development is established.**

6 **“(2) The task force consists of 17 members appointed as follows:**

7 **“(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from
8 among members of the Senate.**

9 **“(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two
10 members from among members of the House of Representatives.**

11 **“(c) The Governor shall appoint 13 members as follows:**

12 **“(A) One member who represents commercial fishing interests;**

13 **“(B) One member who represents recreational fishing interests;**

14 **“(C) One member who represents the marine construction or repair
15 industry;**

16 **“(D) One member who represents the marine vessel construction
17 or repair industry;**

18 **“(E) One member who represents marine transportation or transit
19 services;**

20 **“(F) One member who represents mariners;**

21 **“(G) One member who represents cities;**

1 **“(H) One member who represents counties;**
2 **“(I) One member who represents ports;**
3 **“(J) One member who represents the State Workforce and Talent**
4 **Development Board;**
5 **“(K) One member who represents Clatsop Community College;**
6 **“(L) One member who represents Oregon Coast Community College;**
7 **and**
8 **“(M) One member who represents Oregon State University.**
9 **“(3) In making appointments under subsection (2) of this section,**
10 **the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Repre-**
11 **sentatives shall prioritize appointing to the task force members of the**
12 **Senate and members of the House of Representatives who represent**
13 **coastal districts or districts that border the Columbia River.**
14 **“(4) The task force shall, consistent with and in continuation of the**
15 **work of the Task Force on Maritime Sector Workforce Development**
16 **established in section 3, chapter 738, Oregon Laws 2017:**
17 **“(a) Study and develop a description of the scope and extent of the**
18 **maritime sector and the maritime sector workforce in Oregon, which**
19 **shall include those members of the maritime sector workforce who are**
20 **Oregon taxpayers but who work outside Oregon.**
21 **“(b) Develop recommendations for the State Workforce and Talent**
22 **Development Board to address the maritime sector in the unified plan**
23 **for a statewide workforce development system required by ORS 660.324.**
24 **Recommendations developed under this paragraph shall take into ac-**
25 **count:**
26 **“(A) The needs of the maritime sector in Oregon;**
27 **“(B) The continuing economic health of the maritime sector in**
28 **Oregon; and**
29 **“(C) Opportunities for Oregonians to acquire family wage jobs in**
30 **the maritime sector.**

1 **“(5) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes**
2 **a quorum for the transaction of business.**

3 **“(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a**
4 **majority of the voting members of the task force.**

5 **“(7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as**
6 **chairperson.**

7 **“(8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority**
8 **shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.**

9 **“(9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the**
10 **call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the**
11 **task force.**

12 **“(10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation**
13 **of the task force.**

14 **“(11) The task force shall, no later than September 15, 2020, submit**
15 **a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, that may include**
16 **recommendations for legislation, to:**

17 **“(a) One or more interim committees of the Legislative Assembly**
18 **related to workforce development; and**

19 **“(b) The State Workforce and Talent Development Board for the**
20 **board’s consideration when updating or amending the unified plan for**
21 **a statewide workforce development system required by ORS 660.324.**

22 **“(12) The Association of Oregon Counties shall provide staff support**
23 **to the task force, dependent on resources available for such purposes.**

24 **“(13) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task**
25 **force are nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an ad-**
26 **visory capacity only.**

27 **“(14) Members of the task force who are not members of the Leg-**
28 **islative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement**
29 **for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.**

30 **“(15) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111,**

1 are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the task
2 force’s duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to
3 confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the
4 task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

5 **“SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on December 31,**
6 **2020.**

7 **“SECTION 3. (1) The State Workforce and Talent Development**
8 **Board shall conduct a study and analyze how to best implement the**
9 **recommendations developed by:**

10 **“(a) The Task Force on Maritime Sector Workforce Development**
11 **established in section 3, chapter 738, Oregon Laws 2017; and**

12 **“(b) The Task Force on Maritime Sector Workforce Development**
13 **established in section 1 of this 2019 Act.**

14 **“(2)(a) The board shall submit a report in the manner provided in**
15 **ORS 192.245, including initial recommendations made under subsection**
16 **(1)(a) of this section, to the interim committees of the Legislative As-**
17 **sembly responsible for workforce development no later than September**
18 **15, 2020.**

19 **“(b) In addition to the report submitted under paragraph (a) of this**
20 **subsection, the board shall submit a report in the manner provided in**
21 **ORS 192.245, including the cumulative recommendations made under**
22 **subsection (1) of this section, to the interim committees of the Legis-**
23 **lative Assembly responsible for workforce development no later than**
24 **September 15, 2022.**

25 **“SECTION 4. Section 3 of this 2019 Act is repealed on December 31,**
26 **2022.**

27 **“SECTION 5. This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate**
28 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
29 **declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**
