

Requested by Senator BEYER

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 780**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “and” delete the rest of the line and
2 insert “declaring an emergency.”.

3 Delete lines 7 through 9 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:**

5 **“(a) ‘Cooperating agencies’ means the Oregon Health Authority, the**
6 **Public Employees’ Benefit Board, the Oregon Educators Benefit Board**
7 **and the Department of Consumer and Business Services.**

8 **“(b) ‘Service region’ means Josephine County, Jackson County,**
9 **Curry County and southern Douglas County.**

10 **“(2) The cooperating agencies shall establish a pilot program to**
11 **consolidate health insurance plans offered by the Public Employees’**
12 **Benefit Board, the Oregon Educators Benefit Board and the state**
13 **medical assistance program into one contract with distinct plan-**
14 **specific benefits. The cooperating agencies shall contract with one**
15 **insurer to provide health insurance to participants in health insurance**
16 **plans offered by the Public Employees’ Benefit Board, the Oregon Ed-**
17 **ucators Benefit Board and the state medical assistance program in the**
18 **service region. The pilot program must feature:**

19 **“(a) A blended monthly payment applicable to participants in the**
20 **health insurance plan provided by the contracting insurer under the**
21 **pilot program;**

1 **“(b) A global budget for hospital services offered to participants in**
2 **the health insurance plan provided by the contracting insurer under**
3 **the pilot program;**

4 **“(c) A model in which the contracting insurer is responsible for an**
5 **aligned care model and payments to health care providers for partic-**
6 **ipants in the health insurance plan provided by the contracting insurer**
7 **under the pilot program; and**

8 **“(d) A model in which participants in health insurance plans offered**
9 **by the Public Employees’ Benefit Board and the Oregon Educators**
10 **Benefit Board are not required to participate in the plan provided by**
11 **the contracting insurer under the pilot program.**

12 **“(3) The Oregon Health Authority and the Department of Consumer**
13 **and Business Services shall adopt rules no later than October 1, 2019,**
14 **to implement the pilot program no later than October 1, 2020, includ-**
15 **ing but not limited to rules relating to:**

16 **“(a) Contract procurement.**

17 **“(b) Benefit design.**

18 **“(c) Rate development.**

19 **“(d) Payment.**

20 **“(e) Quality metrics.**

21 **“(f) Reporting requirements.**

22 **“SECTION 3. The Oregon Health Authority and the Department of**
23 **Consumer and Business Services shall report on the pilot program es-**
24 **tablished under section 2 of this 2019 Act to a committee or interim**
25 **committee of the Legislative Assembly related to health care no later**
26 **than July 1 of 2021, 2023 and 2025. The report must include:**

27 **“(1) An analysis of reductions in the cost of care and the ability to**
28 **comply with ORS 243.135 (8) and 243.866 (9).**

29 **“(2) An analysis of improvements in quality performance measures,**
30 **care coordination, case management and health outcomes.**

1 **“(3) Comparative data analysis illustrating performance of the pilot**
2 **program in comparison to the performance of health insurance plans**
3 **offered by the Public Employees’ Benefit Board, the Oregon Educators**
4 **Benefit Board and the state medical assistance program at the state-**
5 **wide and regional levels.**

6 **“SECTION 4. (1) Sections 1 and 2 of this 2019 Act are repealed on**
7 **January 2, 2025.**

8 **“(2) Section 3 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2, 2026.**

9 **“SECTION 5. This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate**
10 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
11 **declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
