

Requested by SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 1005**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “safety” insert “; amending sections 1
2 and 2, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014; and declaring an emergency”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 9 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1.** Section 1, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014, as amended by
5 section 6, chapter 74, Oregon Laws 2016, is amended to read:

6 **“Sec. 1.** (1) The Task Force on School Safety is established, consisting
7 of [16] **18** members as follows:

8 “(a) The Superintendent of State Police or the superintendent’s designee.

9 “(b) The Director of the Department of Public Safety Standards and
10 Training or the director’s designee.

11 “(c) The Governor’s Public Safety Policy Advisor.

12 “(d) The Governor’s Education Policy Advisor.

13 “(e) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among
14 members of the Senate.

15 “(f) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one mem-
16 ber from among members of the House of Representatives.

17 “(g) The Governor shall appoint [10] **12** members as follows:

18 “(A) A member of the Oregon State Sheriffs’ Association;

19 “(B) A member of the Oregon Association Chiefs of Police;

20 “(C) A member of the Oregon Fire Chiefs Association;

21 “(D) A member of the Oregon Education Association;

- 1 “(E) A member of the Oregon School Employees Association;
- 2 “(F) A member of the Oregon School Boards Association;
- 3 “(G) A member of the Oregon Association of Education Service Districts;
- 4 “(H) A member of the Confederation of Oregon School Administrators;
- 5 “(I) A member representing the Department of Education; *[and]*
- 6 “(J) A member of the Association of Oregon Community Mental Health
- 7 Programs[.];
- 8 **“(K) A member of the Oregon Health Authority; and**
- 9 **“(L) A member of the Office of Emergency Management.**

10 “(2) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are

11 nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity

12 only.

13 “(3) The task force shall:

14 “(a)(A) Develop a request for proposals to be published by the Department

15 of State Police for hiring a vendor to create a database of floor plans for all

16 schools within the state, accessible to authorized users via the Internet; and

17 “(B) Make recommendations to the Department of State Police for the

18 development of administrative rules governing the database, including but

19 not limited to:

20 “(i) Specifying the persons and agencies that may have access to the da-

21 tabase;

22 “(ii) Identifying the persons or agencies that will maintain the database;

23 and

24 “(iii) Regulating the manner in which database records are added or

25 modified;

26 “(b) Examine models of existing education and training programs for law

27 enforcement officials, other first responders and school employees in the area

28 of school safety and incident response; and

29 “(c) Examine models for existing protocols for school safety and incident

30 response and consider whether standardized statewide school safety and in-

1 cident response protocols would be appropriate.

2 “(4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a
3 quorum for the transaction of business.

4 “(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority
5 of the voting members of the task force.

6 “(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson
7 and one of its members to serve as vice chairperson.

8 “(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall
9 make an appointment to become immediately effective.

10 “(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call
11 of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.

12 “(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the
13 task force.

14 “(10) The task force shall submit a report concerning the floor plan da-
15 tabase in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommen-
16 dations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly
17 related to the judiciary as appropriate no later than September 1, 2017. A
18 second report shall be submitted in a similar manner no later than September
19 1, 2019. **A third report shall be submitted in a similar manner no later**
20 **than September 1, 2021.**

21 “(11) The Department of State Police shall provide staff support to the
22 task force.

23 “(12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative
24 Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual
25 and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance
26 of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS
27 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the task
28 force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Department of State
29 Police for purposes of the task force.

30 “(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are di-

1 rected to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the
2 extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such infor-
3 mation and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to
4 perform their duties.

5 **“SECTION 2.** Section 2, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014, as amended by
6 section 7, chapter 74, Oregon Laws 2016, is amended to read:

7 **“Sec. 2.** Section 1, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014, is repealed on December
8 31, [2019] **2021.**

9 **“SECTION 3. This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate**
10 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
11 **declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect July 1, 2019.”.**

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
