

Requested by Senator HEARD

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 111**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “wine” delete the rest of the
2 line and insert “; and prescribing an effective date.”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 27 and delete page 2 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Winery and Winemakers Task Force**
5 **is established.**

6 **“(2) The task force consists of 24 members appointed as follows:**

7 **“(a) The Senate Majority Leader shall appoint one member from**
8 **among members of the Senate majority caucus to be a nonvoting**
9 **member of the task force.**

10 **“(b) The Senate Minority Leader shall appoint one member from**
11 **among members of the Senate minority caucus to be a nonvoting**
12 **member of the task force.**

13 **“(c) The House of Representatives Majority Leader shall appoint one**
14 **member from among members of the House of Representatives ma-**
15 **jority caucus to be a nonvoting member of the task force.**

16 **“(d) The House of Representatives Minority Leader shall appoint**
17 **one member from among members of the House of Representatives**
18 **minority caucus to be a nonvoting member of the task force.**

19 **“(e) Subject to subsection (3) of this section, the Governor shall**
20 **appoint 20 voting members of the task force as follows:**

21 **“(A) Three members must be representatives of wine makers in the**

1 **Southern Oregon American viticultural area;**
2 **“(B) Three members must be representatives of wine grape growers**
3 **in the Southern Oregon American viticultural area;**
4 **“(C) Three members must be representatives of wine makers in the**
5 **Willamette Valley American viticultural area;**
6 **“(D) Three members must be representatives of wine grape growers**
7 **in the Willamette Valley American viticultural area;**
8 **“(E) One member must be a representative of wine makers in the**
9 **Columbia Gorge American viticultural area;**
10 **“(F) One member must be a representative of wine grape growers**
11 **in the Columbia Gorge American viticultural area;**
12 **“(G) One member must be a representative of wine makers in the**
13 **Columbia Valley American viticultural area;**
14 **“(H) One member must be a representative of wine grape growers**
15 **in the Columbia Valley American viticultural area;**
16 **“(I) One member must be a representative of wine makers in the**
17 **Walla Walla Valley American viticultural area;**
18 **“(J) One member must be a representative of wine grape growers**
19 **in the Walla Walla Valley American viticultural area;**
20 **“(K) One member must be a representative of wine makers in the**
21 **Snake River Valley American viticultural area; and**
22 **“(L) One member must be a representative of wine grape growers**
23 **in the Snake River Valley American viticultural area.**
24 **“(3) Only residents of Oregon qualify for appointment by the Gov-**
25 **ernor to the task force.**
26 **“(4) The task force shall investigate the laws, administrative rules**
27 **and policies of this state that relate to wine or wine grapes for the**
28 **purpose of determining whether those laws, rules and policies provide**
29 **effective brand protection for Oregon wines.**
30 **“(5) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes**

1 a quorum for the transaction of business.

2 “(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a
3 majority of the voting members of the task force.

4 “(7) The task force shall elect one of its voting members to serve
5 as chairperson.

6 “(8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority
7 shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.

8 “(9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the
9 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the
10 task force.

11 “(10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation
12 of the task force.

13 “(11) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided
14 in ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to
15 an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to business
16 no later than September 15, 2020.

17 “(12) The Oregon Liquor Control Commission shall provide staff
18 support to the task force.

19 “(13) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task
20 force are nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an ad-
21 visory capacity only.

22 “(14) Members of the task force who are not members of the Leg-
23 islative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement
24 for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.

25 “(15) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111,
26 are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the duties
27 of the task force and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to
28 confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the
29 task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

30 **SECTION 2.** Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on December 31,

1 2020.

2 **“SECTION 3. This 2019 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the**
3 **date on which the 2019 regular session of the eightieth Legislative**
4 **Assembly adjourns sine die.”.**

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
