## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 1035

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 28.

2 On page 2, delete lines 1 and 2 and insert:

3 "SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section and section 2 of this 2019
4 Act:

5 "(a) 'Care recipient' means an individual who:

6 "(A) Has income below 400 percent of the federal poverty guidelines;

7 "(B) Does not qualify for medical assistance, as defined in ORS
8 414.025; and

9 "(C)(i) Is 55 years of age or older and has a chronic illness or disa10 bling condition that requires nursing facility level of care; or

"(ii) Is under 55 years of age and has been diagnosed with dementia.
 "(b) 'Unpaid caregiver' means an individual who provides uncom pensated in-home care to a care recipient and who is:

14 "(A) A family member of the care recipient; or

"(B) Another individual who is in a close relationship with the care
 recipient, as defined by the Department of Human Services by rule.

"(2) The Oregon Health Authority, in collaboration with the de partment and based on the advice of the advisory committee convened
 under section 2 of this 2019 Act, shall:

"(a) Design a program for a limited benefit package to be provided
 to care recipients that includes:

"(A) Up to \$500 per month in supports or services such as care co ordination, respite care, durable medical equipment or training and
 education for unpaid caregivers; and

"(B) Other supports and services necessary to preserve and enhance
the quality of life of care recipients and to prevent or delay their need
for more costly institutional or in-home and community-based care.

"(b) No later than June 30, 2020, apply for any necessary approval
from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to secure federal
financial participation in the cost of the limited benefit package designed under paragraph (a) of this subsection.

"(3) If a demonstration project under section 1115 of the Social Se-11 curity Act is necessary to secure federal financial participation in the 12cost of the limited benefit package and the authority deems it inad-13 visable to request an amendment to the demonstration project that is 14 in effect on the effective date of this 2019 Act, the authority shall 15submit an application to operate a new demonstration project to allow 16 the authority to offer the limited benefit package with the support of 17 federal financing. 18

"(4) No later than December 31, 2020, the authority shall report to the Legislative Assembly, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, on the status of any federal approval sought in accordance with subsection (3) of this section and legislative changes, if any, that are necessary to offer the limited benefit package.".

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
