PROPOSED MINORITY REPORT AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 978

1 Delete line 9 of the printed bill and insert:

<u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The Department of State Police shall conduct a
 study on:

4 "(a) The percentage of firearms reported stolen in this state that
 5 are successfully recovered; and

6 "(b) How firearm serial numbers are used by law enforcement 7 agencies and the extent to which firearm serial numbers are used to 8 solve crimes in this state.

"(2) The department shall present the results of the study described
in subsection (1) of this section, along with any recommended legislative changes, in a report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner
provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2020.

"SECTION 3. The Department of State Police shall report annually
 to the Legislative Assembly, in the manner provided under ORS
 192.245, on:

"(1) The number of firearm transfer criminal background checks
 that are delayed more than 30 minutes;

18 **"(2) The length of time of the delays;**

"(3) The number of delays that result in a determination that the
 firearm purchaser or recipient is disqualified; and

21 "(4) The reasons for the determination that the firearm purchaser

1 or recipient is disqualified.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall
 conduct a study by reviewing criminal conviction data and determin ing:

6 "(a) The number of crimes each year committed in this state in
6 which a firearm reported stolen was involved; and

"(b) The number of firearm-related crimes each year committed in
this state by persons licensed to carry concealed handguns under ORS
166.291 and 166.292.

"(2) The commission shall present the results of the study described
 in subsection (1) of this section, along with any recommended legisla tive changes, in a report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner
 provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2020.

"SECTION 5. The Oregon Health Authority shall conduct a comprehensive, comparative study on firearm-related deaths in relation to all other major causes of death in this state, and present the results of the study, along with any recommended legislative changes, in a report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2020.

20 "<u>SECTION 6.</u> (1) The Department of Consumer and Business ser-21 vices shall conduct a study on the availability of insurance coverage 22 for firearm owners held strictly liable for the actions of another person 23 who obtained the firearm without authorization and used the firearm 24 to commit a crime.

"(2) The department shall present the results of the study described
in subsection (1) of this section, along with any recommended legislative changes, in a report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner
provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2020.".
