PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 5

- In line 3 of the printed joint resolution, delete "Section 8a" and insert
- ² "Sections 1, 2, 8a, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 17 and 18" and delete "is" and insert
- 3 "are".
- 4 After line 4, insert:
- "Sec. 1. The [cheif] chief executive power of the State, shall be vested
- 6 in a Governor, who shall hold [his] **the** office for the term of four years; and
- 7 no person shall be eligible to such office more than Eight, in any period of
- 8 twelve years.[—]
- 9 "Sec. 2. No person except a citizen of the United States, shall be eligible
- to the Office of Governor, nor shall any person be eligible to that office who
- shall not have attained the age of thirty years, and who shall not have been
- three years next preceding [his] the person's election, a resident within this
- 13 State. The minimum age requirement of this section does not apply to a
- person who succeeds to the office of Governor under section 8a of this Ar-
- 15 ticle.".
- In line 5, before "death" insert "Governor's".
- 17 After line 22, insert:
- "Sec. 9. The Governor shall be commander in [cheif] chief of the military,
- and naval forces of this State, and may call out such forces to execute the
- 20 laws, to suppress [insurection] insurrection, or to repel invasion.
- "Sec. 10. [He] The Governor shall take care that the Laws be faithfully

- 1 executed.[—]
- "Sec. 11. [He] The Governor shall from time to time give to the Legis-
- 3 lative Assembly information touching the condition of the State, and
- 4 [reccommend] recommend such measures as [he] the Governor shall judge
- 5 to be expedient.
- **"Sec. 12.** [He] **The Governor** may on extraordinary occasions convene
- 7 the Legislative Assembly by proclamation, and shall state to both houses
- 8 when assembled, the purpose for which they shall have been convened.[—]
- 9 "Sec. 13. [He] The Governor shall transact all necessary business with
- the officers of government, and may require information in writing from the
- offices of the Administrative, and Military Departments upon any subject
- relating to the duties of their respective offices.[—]
- "Sec. 14. (1) [He] The Governor shall have power to grant reprieves,
- 14 commutations, and pardons, after conviction, for all [offences] offenses ex-
- cept treason, subject to such regulations as may be provided by law. Upon
- conviction of a person for treason [he] the Governor shall have power to
- suspend the execution of the sentence until the case shall be reported to the
- 18 Legislative Assembly, at its next meeting, when the Legislative Assembly
- 19 shall either grant a pardon, commute the sentence, direct the execution of
- 20 the sentence, or grant a [farther] further reprieve.[—]
- "(2) [He] **The Governor** shall have power to remit fines, and forfeitures,
- 22 under such regulations as may be prescribed by law; and shall report to the
- 23 Legislative Assembly at its next meeting each case of reprieve, commutation,
- or pardon granted, and the reasons for granting the same; and also the names
- of all persons in whose favor remission of fines, and forfeitures shall have
- been made, and the several amounts remitted.
- "Sec. 17. [He] The Governor shall issue writs of Election to fill such
- vacancies as may have [occured] occurred in the Legislative Assembly.
- "Sec. 18. All commissions shall issue in the name of the State; shall be
- 30 signed by the [Governor, sealed with the seal of the State, and

attested by the Secretary of State.[—]".

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
