6 **chapter __, Oregon Laws 2019 (Enrolled House Bill 3427), for the fol-**

22 **“SECTION 8. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
23 **the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July**
24 **1, 2019, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses by the De-**
25 **partment of Education from the Statewide Education Initiatives Ac-**
26 **count established by section 24, chapter __, Oregon Laws 2019**
27 **(Enrolled House Bill 3427), for the following purposes:**

- 28 (1) Professional development and
29 training for educators..... \$ 15,000,000
- 30 (2) Operations..... \$ 19,839,266

1 **SECTION 9. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
2 **the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (6), chapter __,**
3 **Oregon Laws 2019 (Enrolled Senate Bill 5515), as the maximum limit**
4 **for payment of expenses from fees, moneys, or other revenues, in-**
5 **cluding Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal**
6 **funds, collected or received by the Department of Justice, for the**
7 **General Counsel Division, is increased by \$464,086 for the purposes of**
8 **implementing the provisions of chapter __, Oregon Laws 2019 (En-**
9 **rolled House Bill 3427).**

10 **SECTION 10. Sections 4 to 8 of this 2019 Act become operative on**
11 **the date that chapter __, Oregon Laws 2019 (Enrolled House Bill 3427),**
12 **becomes law.**

13 **SECTION 11. This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate**
14 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
15 **declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect July 1, 2019.”.**
