"SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, 22the amount of \$24,860,000 is established for a six-year period beginning 23July 1, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, 24moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-2526 cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of pro-27ceeds from state bonds issued for the benefit of a community college, 28pursuant to agreements between the commission and a community 29 college. 30

"Sec. 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the 14 amount of [\$405,475,000] \$399,475,000 is established for a six-year period be-15ginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from 16 fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and re-17 imbursements from federal service agreements, but excluding lottery funds 18 and federal funds not described in this section, collected or received by the 19 Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds 20from state bonds issued for the benefit of a public university, pursuant to 21agreements between the commission and a public university. 22

"<u>SECTION 8.</u> This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
 declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect July 1, 2019.".

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
