

HB 4041 Amendments

Policy Option Descriptions

Amendment 1: The Baseline bill with the following changes:

Oregon State Fire Marshal's office:

- Superintendent of State Police retains the right to make the timely exercise of the authority under ORS 476.510 to 476.610 if the Governor is unavailable, but the State Fire Marshal will work in consultation with the Director of the Oregon Department of Emergency Management to prepare plans for the effective carrying out of the provisions of ORS 476.520 to 476.610.
 - Page 19 Section 23: Delete 25-31
 - Page 20 Delete 1-4

- Keep Search and Rescue program in Oregon Emergency Management.
 - Page 1 Draft Summary: Delete – Transfer search and functions from Office of Emergency Management to Department of the State Fire Marshal
 - Page 92 Delete section 97,98,99
 - Page 93 Delete section 99,100,101
 - Page 94 Delete section 101
 - Page 95 Delete section 101,102,103
 - Page 96 Delete section 103,104

Oregon Health Authority

- Restore the ability of the Public Health Director to take additional actions to address a public health emergency if approved by the Governor instead of the Director of the Oregon Department of Emergency Management.
 - Section 18, page 15, line 18-19 Restore “Governor” and delete “Director of the Oregon Department of Emergency Management”

- Add that The Public Health Director will work in consultation with the **Director of the Oregon Department of Emergency Management** to take other actions necessary to address the public health emergency and provide notice of those actions to health care providers, institutions and facilities, including public health actions authorized by ORS 431A.015

- Ensure that OHA continues to collect individually identifiable health information during a declared emergency.
 - Section 18, page 17, lines 4-5, lines 18-20, and lines 24-25 Delete “Director of the Oregon Department of Emergency Management”

- The Oregon Health Authority will convene with existing EMS and Trauma advisory committee to draft recommendations to the Legislature for an Emergency Medical Services Mobilization Plan by September 1st, 2021.

Oregon Department of Energy

- The Oregon Department of Energy retains all their responsibilities regarding Nuclear power plants or nuclear fueled power.

Add Disaster Service Leave Protection:

An employee in the State of Oregon who is a certified disaster service volunteer of the American Red cross or who is a verified Team Rubicon or a verified member of any group identified by the office of emergency management to be a valid emergency response organization may be granted leave from work for not to exceed thirty work days in each year to participate in specialized disaster relief services, upon the request of their sponsoring organization. The employee may use leave compensation entitled to them.

Amendment 2: Narrows the bill to include:

- The Office of Emergency Management Reorganization to the Oregon Department of Emergency Management
- Creation of the Oregon Department of Emergency Management as an independent state agency
- Disaster Service Leave Protection.

Amendment 3: Narrows the bill to Include:

- The Office of State Fire Marshal reorganization to the Department of the State Fire Marshal
- Creation of the Department of the State Fire Marshal as an independent state agency.
- Disaster Service Leave Protection.

Amendment 4: Narrows the bill to include:

- The Creation of the Emergency Preparedness Advisory Council which will advise and make policy recommendations to the State Resilience Officer regarding local, regional, state, tribal, resiliency and organized in alignment with FEMA recognized Emergency Support Functions (ESFs).
- The Creation of the Local Government Emergency Management Advisory Council to provide Director of the Office of Emergency Management (within OMD) regular advice/guidance on OEM preparedness efforts.
- Addition of the Disaster Service Leave Protection.

Amendment 5: Effective Date for Reorganizations moved to 2024 and Adds the Disaster Service Leave Protection

Amendment 6: Effective Date for Reorganization moved to 2025 and Adds the Disaster Service Leave Protection

Amendment 7: Compromise Option

- Reclassifies the Director of the Office of Emergency Management as a Governor Appointed, Senate Confirmed position – within the OMD
- The Creation of the Emergency Preparedness Advisory Council which will advise and make policy recommendations to State Resilience Officer regarding local, regional, state, tribal, resiliency and organized in alignment with FEMA recognized Emergency Support Functions (ESFs).

- The Creation of the Local Government Emergency Management Advisory Council to provide Director of the Office of Emergency Management (within OMD) regular advice/guidance on OEM preparedness efforts.
- Creates a Task Force that shall develop a comprehensive study of all relevant emergency structures and systems and report back to the legislature no later than December of 2021 on recommendations for a model statutory and functional structure and systems of emergency management aligned with federal emergency management priorities. Recommendations will be aimed at a target of July 2023 for implementation.
