

The following highlights the changes in regulation of medical marijuana grow sites if HB 4034 passes:

- OMMP registered grow sites with 3 or more patients or 3 or more growers that are required to track in OLCC's cannabis tracking system (CTS) will be regulated by OLCC. By September 1, 2020, these grow sites must either:
 - Register with OLCC; or
 - Reduce the grow site's patient count to 2 or fewer
- OLCC medical marijuana registration is only available to grow sites that:
 - Were registered with OMMP before February 1, 2020; and
 - Before April 1, 2020, had 3 or more patients or 3 or more growers; and
 - Before April 1, 2020, was subject to tracking in CTS.
- OLCC is currently inspecting the OMMP grow sites that are tracking in CTS. These changes streamline oversight over larger medical marijuana grow sites by allowing OLCC to not only inspect, but to take enforcement action for non-compliance.
- Patients who have a grower that is growing at an OMMP registered medical marijuana grow site that opts to be registered with OLCC will have until November 1, 2020, to request that seeds, plants or usable marijuana that are the patient's property, be returned to them.
- OLCC registered medical marijuana grow sites:
 - Will be able to transfer usable marijuana to any patient registered with OMMP.
 - Will be subject to the same plant counts and usable marijuana possession limits that exist now under OMMP and will not have a canopy.
- OLCC registered medical marijuana grow sites will be subject to the same or similar rules that they are subject to now under OMMP.
- On and after April 1, 2020, OMMP will not register more than 2 patients at a grow site.
- OMMP grow sites can have per patient regardless of zoning:
 - 6 mature plants (for a maximum of 12);
 - 12 immature plants over 24 inches (for a maximum of 24);
 - The number of immature plants under 24 inches established by OMMP in rule.
- Patients will continue to "own" the plants and usable marijuana produced at OMMP registered grow sites, subject to any agreements between a patient and their grower.
- An OMMP registered grow site with 3 or more patients or growers that does not elect to register with OLCC or reduce its patient count by September 1, 2020, will have its registration expire with no right to appeal.
