# WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Appropriates \$2,616,255 from the general fund to the Department of Administrative Services for the Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) Fund established in ORS 184.489. The moneys may be used to hire staff and increase the number and diversity of CASA Volunteer Programs. Declares emergency. Effective on passage.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued. FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued.

#### **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

### **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

### **BACKGROUND:**

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) are volunteers appointed by courts to advocate on behalf of abused and neglected children. They investigate, examine, and recommend the best options to a court, for a child to be safe, have a permanent home, and to thrive. CASAs spend the majority of their time interviewing people involved in the child's life and the case, including teachers, foster parents, attorneys, caseworkers, counselors, parents, medical professionals, and family members to determine the facts and circumstances of the child's situation.

CASAs receive approximately 40 hours of in-depth training through their local CASA Volunteer Program. Upon completion, all volunteers are sworn in by a local judge and may be assigned to cases. CASA supervisors provide guidance and support to volunteers for the duration of each case.

House Bill 4141 appropriates \$2,616,255 from the general fund to the Department of Administrative Services for the Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) Fund.
