### **Measure Description:**

Requires Oregon Health Authority in collaboration with specified stakeholder groups, to identify, assess and prepare report on regulatory and policy barriers to effective and timely behavioral health treatment for individuals with co-occurring disorders.

#### **Analysis:**

SB 1553 with the -2 amendment requires the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) in collaboration with specified stakeholders to identify, assess, and prepare a report on the regulatory and policy barriers that limit access to effective and timely treatment of individual and facility licensing credentialing to treat co-occurring disorders. OHA must submit this report to the Legislature by September 15, 2020.

OHA estimates the substance of this work to be in addition to existing program capacity and for the fiscal impact to be \$653,442 Total Funds [\$319,196 General Fund, \$334,246 Federal Funds] and 1 position (0.63 FTE) for the 2019-21 biennium; and \$87,535 Total Funds [\$39,469 General Fund, \$48,066 Federal Funds] and 1 position (0.33 FTE) for the 2021-23 biennium. Due to the time frame, OHA anticipates establishing one limited duration Operations and Policy Analyst 4 (OPA4) position to work with a consultant to produce the required report. After submitting the report, the OPA4 would continue with formulating policy recommendations and shepherding the implementation of approved recommendations. This work is eligible for Medicaid match.

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
