The outdoor industry provides meaningful careers and jobs for our graduates all across Oregon, and has the potential to economically invigorate rural areas where most outdoor activities occur. The HB 4157 allows outdoor entrepreneurs to foster their creativity and tap into much needed funds for startup businesses. I am also a board member of the Oregon Outdoor Alliance and chair of the Southern Oregon Chapter where I have witnessed firsthand the power of the outdoor industry to create meaningful lives. Here in Southern Oregon, many economic endeavors have come to fruition by means of outdoor oriented business such as Sunday Afternoon Hats, Sotar Inflatable Rafts, and Sawyer Oars.
