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Measure Description:

Modifies statewide greenhouse gas emissions reduction goals.

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the Senate Committee on Environment and Natural Resources to the Senate Committee on Rules.

The measure establishes the Oregon Greenhouse Gas Initiative, with the goal of reducing anthropogenic greenhouse gas emissions levels in Oregon by 45% below 1990 emissions levels by 2035; and 80% below 1990 emissions levels by 2050.

The measure is anticipated to have an impact on the Oregon State Treasurer, Employment Department, Department of Consumer and Business Services, Office of the Governor, Housing and Community Services Department, Department of Administrative Services, Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board, Legislative Revenue Office, Department of Land Conservation and Development, Oregon Judicial Department, Department of State Lands, Oregon Department of Transportation, Water Resources Department, Public Utility Commission, Department of Energy, Department of Environmental Quality, Department of Fish and Wildlife, Department of Forestry, Oregon Health Authority, Department of Justice, Oregon Department of Agriculture, Counties, Cities, Legislative Assembly, and Higher Education Coordinating Commission.
