WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to study health care in Oregon and submit its findings no later than September 15, 2020. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued.

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-3 Establishes the Emergency Medical Services Innovation Program in Department of Human Services (DHS) to select, fund, and monitor local public sector pilot projects. Specifies the program is to promote efficient, quality, and appropriate use of emergency medical services in residential and long-term care facilities. Creates and specifies membership of the Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council. Directs DHS to staff the Council and prepare a report for the Council on the pilot projects. Prohibits local government from regulating or imposing fees on a long-term care or residential care facility that is regulated by DHS under federal or state law, unless expressly provided by state law. Takes effect on the 91st day after passage.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued. FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued.
