PRIMARY GOAL OF THE WORKER PROTECTION STANDARD (WPS)

"Prevent unreasonable adverse effects from exposure to pesticides among agricultural workers and pesticide handlers, vulnerable groups and other persons who may be on or near agricultural establishments, and to mitigate exposures that do occur."

IN AGRICULTURAL ESTABLISHMENTS WHERE AG PESTICIDES ARE USED IN THE PRODUCTION OF PLANTS

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Read all Directions for Use carefully before applying.

Do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application. For any requirements specific to your state or tribe, consult the agency responsible for pesticide regulation.

AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR part 170. This Standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers on farms, forests, nurseries, and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification, and emergency assistance. It also contains specific instructions and exceptions pertaining to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE), and restricted entry interval. The requirements in this box only apply to uses of this product that are covered by the Worker Protection Standard.

Do not enter or allow worker entry into treated areas during the restricted entry interval (REI). The REI for each crop is listed in the directions for use associated with each crop.

Certified crop advisors or persons entering under their direct supervision under certain circumstances may be exempt from the early reentry requirement pursuant to 40 CFR Part 170.

PPE required for early entry into treated areas that is permitted under the Worker Protection Standard and that involves contact with anything that has been treated, such as plants, soil, or water, is:

- Coveralls over short-sleeved shirt and short pants
- · Chemical-resistant gloves made of any waterproof material
- Chemical-resistant footwear plus socks
- Chemical-resistant headgear for overhead exposures

Notify workers of the application by warning them orally and by posting warning signs at entrances to treated areas.

THE WPS APPLIES TO WORKERS AND HANDLERS



WHO IS A 'WORKER'?

- Any person, including a self-employed person, who is employed and performs activities <u>directly relating</u> to the production of agricultural <u>plants</u> on an agricultural establishment.
- The WPS requirements apply to a worker if they work in areas that were treated with a WPS-labeled pesticide within the last 30 days, or where a restricted-entry interval was in effect in the last 30 days



Examples of "directly related" activities include:

- Harvesting
- Thinning
- Hand-weeding
- Pest-scouting
- Pruning
- Planting
- Preparing sites/media for planting
- Carrying nursery stock
- Watering



Examples of activities "not directly" related:

- Delivering materials to the establishment
- Buying pesticides or application equipment
- Carrying or moving pesticide containers that have never been opened
- Post-harvest handling of ag products outside the treated area(s)
- Caring for livestock
- Using herbicides in non-agricultural areas like roadsides and parking lots
- Beekeeping activities



WHO IS A 'HANDLER'?

- Mixing, loading, helping to apply, or applying pesticides
- Disposing of pesticides
- Handling open containers of pesticides
- Acting as a flagger
- Cleaning, adjusting, handling, or repairing equipment that may have pesticide residues

OREGON EXPANDED UPON AEZ RULE

Overview of additional Oregon OSHA protective measures

Oregon OSHA's Application Exclusion Zone (AEZ) rules exceed U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requirements in several ways, which this chart illustrates.

The chart does not encompass all AEZ requirements as part of the updates to the Worker Protection Standard, including the 25foot AEZ requirements when pesticides are not applied aerially or through an air blast sprayer. The exclusion zone is adjacent to – but outside of – the pesticide-treated area itself. The zone provides an additional level of protection beyond those protections enforced with respect to the treated area itself. The zone surrounds and moves with pesticide-spray equipment during applications. The zone must be free of all people other than appropriately trained and equipped pesticide handlers.

Adopted EPA Rules

- The Application Exclusion Zone (AEZ) requires people to move 100 feet away from an area being treated with pesticides
- People allowed to return to AEZ immediately after the pesticide-spray equipment has passed by
- People must not re-enter the pesticide-treated area itself for the time specified by pesticide labeling

Oregon OSHA's AEZ rules extend the AEZ by 50 feet when the pesticide applicator is required to use a respirator.

Adopted Oregon OSHA Rules

- The AEZ is 100 feet when pesticide applicator is not required to use a respirator. People must stay out of the AEZ for an additional 15 minutes, either by staying indoors or remaining evacuated.
- People must not re-enter the pesticide-treated area itself for the time specified by pesticide labeling
- The AEZ expands to 150 feet when the pesticide applicator is required to use a respirator. People must stay out of the AEZ for an additional 15 minutes. No option to stay indoors
- People must not re-enter the pesticide-treated area itself for the time specified by pesticide labeling






CERTIFICATION VS. LICENSING

 Certification – demonstrating knowledge and skills to apply pesticides legally and without causing harm or damage to themselves, others, or the environment.




• Licensing - permits you to perform certain pesticide-related tasks that would otherwise be prohibited by law.





CORE COMPETENCIES





(1) Label and labeling comprehension.

(2) Safety. Measures to avoid or minimize adverse health effects.

(3) *Environment.* The potential environmental consequences of the use and misuse of pesticides; effects of weather, soil, and terrain.

(4) Pests. The proper identification and effective control of pests

(5) Characteristics of pesticides – Types, Persistence, Residue Hazards.

(6) *Equipment.* Types, Limitations, Maintenance, and Calibration.

(7) Application methods. Selecting appropriate application methods.

(8) Laws and regulations. Knowledge of all applicable State, Tribal, and Federal laws and regulations, including understanding the Worker Protection Standard and the circumstances where compliance is required.
(9) Stewardship – Security and Communication.



EXAMPLES: WHEN PESTICIDE LICENSING IS REQUIRED

Private Applicator License

Buy, apply, or supervise the use of Restricted Use Pesticides (RUPs) on your own/employer's agricultural land (*e.g.* farmland, ranches, forestland, nurseries, and orchards).

Commercial Applicator License

Apply RUPs, or supervise the application of any pesticide to someone else's property (with certain exceptions).

Public Applicator License

Apply or supervise the application of any pesticide as a public employee using power-driven application equipment, or restricted use pesticides.

Aerial Applicator License

Apply any pesticide by aircraft (*e.g.* fixed-wing, helicopter, unmanned aircraft systems).

LICENSING CATEGORIES

- Required for Commercial/Public Applicators.
- Note: Each category has additional competency standards.

SUPERVISION REQUIREMENTS

Private Applicator

Supervise

Unlicensed Individual

Conditions

- Application to agricultural land owned or leased by the Private Applicator or the employer of the Private Applicator.
- Must undergo specific training (requirement of Worker Protection Standard).

Commercial/Public Applicators

Supervise

- 1. Licensed Pesticide Apprentice
- 2. Licensed Immediately Supervised Trainee

Conditions

- Limited to license categories of supervisor.^{1 & 2}
- Supervisor must be on-site and within 5 minutes of application.²
- Supervisor must be reasonably available (*e.g.* mobile phone, 2-way radio).¹



Who's Affected?

 Anyone using Restricted Use Pesticides (RUPs).

Restricted Use Pesticide

Due to corrosive effects during inhalation and to eyes and skin

For retail sale to and use only by Certified Applicators or persons under their direct supervision and only for those uses covered by the Certified Applicator's Certifications.

Timeline

- Submit plan to EPA: March 4, 2020
- EPA response: March 4, 2022
- Rule/Statute Change: ?



Expansion of Applicator Definition

- Preapplication activities, including mixing/loading
- Applying/Supervising Use
- Other activities, such as transporting/storing open containers, cleaning application equipment, disposal.

Age Requirements

- All applicators must be at least 18 years old.
- Exception for family members working under the supervision of licensed private applicators who are family members must be at least 16 years old (fumigant & aerial work excluded).



New Competency Standards - Examples

Private applicator

- Understanding specific pesticide toxicity and residue potential when pesticides are applied to animal or animal product agricultural commodities.
- Relative hazards associated with using pesticides on animals or places in which animals are confined based on formulation, application technique, age of animal, stress, and extent of treatment.

Commercial/Public

- Agriculture: Insecticide/Fungicide Category Potential for drift, for persistence beyond the intended period of pest control, and for non-target exposures
- Industrial, Institutional, & Structural Category Methods of application that minimize acute and chronic exposure of people and pets, and minimize environmental impacts of outdoor applications.



Non-certified Applicators (Apprentices, Trainee's, etc)

- Annual training on pesticide safety and safe operation of equipment.
- Supervisor must provide site/product specific instructions prior to each application.
- "immediate communication" with their supervisor
- A copy of the pesticide label accessible at all times
- Label-required personal protective equipment (PPE) must be provided.
- Supervisors must ensure equipment is in safe operating condition daily.

PPE RECORDKEEPING REQUIREMENTS

<u>WPS</u>

Personal protective equipment.

Whenever a respirator is required by the pesticide product labeling, the handler employer must ensure that the requirements outlined below are met before the handler performs any handler activity where the respirator is required to be worn.

(i) Handler employers must provide handlers with **fit testing** using the respirator specified on the pesticide product labeling.

(ii) Handler employers must provide handlers with **training in the use of the respirato**r specified on the pesticide product labeling.

(iii) Handler employers must **provide handlers with a medical evaluation** by a physician or other licensed health care professional to ensure the handler's physical ability to safely wear the respirator specified on the pesticide product labeling.

The handler employer must maintain for two years, on the establishment, records documenting the completion of the requirements outlined above.
