Dear Members of the House Natural Resources Committee,

I am writing on behalf of my family of four voters. We urge you to support HB 4075 to make Coyote Killing Contests illegal in the state of Oregon.

1. This is a cruel and unnecessary slaughter of valuable wildlife and causing un-due hardship to the pups and family structures of these animals.

2. For too long, the lie has persisted that the Coyote, **Native to North America**, is vermin. How can Coyotes be native to our land and not serve a valuable ecological role? As a natural part of our ecosystem, Coyotes cull rodents and diseased undulates. **We are livestock owners** and were distressed when a neighbor killed our local Coyote. The next season, our fields, neighbor fields and our garden were destroyed by ground squirrels. That neighbor moved away. Now, we watch with delight as a new Coyote hunts the surrounding fields for rodents. What a joy to see it doing its valuable work.

3. Scientific research proves that **Predators Control Their Own Population** based on the available prey base. Killing Coyotes only causes them to produce larger litters. New Coyotes moving into the vacated place of a slaughtered Coyote, **create Creased Incidents of Livestock Predation.** As a livestock owner, I want to achieve a harmonious relationship with native wildlife.

4. Oregon Fish and Wildlife and other departments across the country, including Georgia, reject these contests — stating that they provide **No Value to Wildlife Management**. Five states have now banned these gruesome contests—including California, Vermont, New Mexico, Arizona, and Massachusetts.
