## HB 4016 -5, -6 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

## WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to study health care in Oregon and submit its findings no later than September 15, 2020. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

# **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

#### **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

-5 Establishes the Emergency Medical Services Innovation Program in Department of Human Services (DHS) to select, fund, and monitor local public sector pilot projects. Specifies the program is to promote efficient, quality, and appropriate use of emergency medical services in residential and long-term care facilities. Creates and specifies membership of the Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council. Directs DHS to staff the Council and prepare and submit a report on the pilot projects. Prohibits local government from regulating or imposing fees on a long-term care or residential care facility that is regulated by DHS under federal or state law, unless expressly provided by state law. Repeals the Innovation Program on January 2, 2024. Takes effect on the 91st day after passage.

REVENUE: Revenue impact statement issued: no impact.

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued.

-6 Specifies the Board of Certified Advanced Estheticians to define in rule the type of device(s) used for advanced nonablative esthetics procedure. Authorizes individuals certified to practice esthetics by the Health Licensing Office to use an item that is not a device. Clarifies and modifies the definitions for types of practices used in esthetics. Defines mechanical or electrical apparatus term; clarifies such apparatuses are not considered lasers or intense pulsed light or device as defined by ORS 676.630 for advanced estheticians.

REVENUE: Revenue impact statement issued: no impact.

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued.
