Measure Description:

Amends residency requirements for purposes of licenses, tags and permits related to wildlife.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW)

Summary of Fiscal Impact:

Costs related to the measure are anticipated to be minimal - See explanatory analysis.

Analysis:

HB 4052 redefines “resident” for the purpose of redefining eligibility for hunting licenses, tags or permits issued by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) to Oregon residents.

ODFW charges different fees amounts depending on if an applicant for a license, tag or permit is a resident or non-resident; non-resident fees are generally much higher than resident fees.

ODFW anticipates that this measure could result in a small change in licensing revenue, but this change is anticipated to be minimal.
