## **Lottery Bills (HB 4153A, HB 4057)**

## **Legislative History**

**HB 3262 in the 1989 legislature** initiated a sports betting program as an additional lottery game with the proceeds of the game dedicated to intercollegiate athletics in Oregon University System institutions.

However, **the legislature in 2005 (HB 3466)** ended sports betting games after the 2006-07 NFL season, as a condition of hosting NCAA Men's Division I Basketball Championship games.

**SB 1049 of the 2019 legislature** has brought back sports betting games and dedicated the net proceeds of these games to the Public Employees Retirement System's (PERS) Employer Incentive Fund established by **SB 1566 in the 2018 legislature**.

Sports betting revenue in the Employer Incentive Fund will be used to fund the state's 25% match to a participating employer contribution.

## HB 4153 A (2020)

Prohibits the Oregon State Lottery from offering any game that is playable on a mobile phone, personal computer or other personal electronic device, except for sports betting games that permit betting before or during a sporting event and multi-state numbers drawing lottery games that were offered in more than 30 states as of January 1, 2019.

## HB 4057 (2020)

*Intro*: Prohibits the Oregon State Lottery from offering games based on outcomes of sporting events organized by, sponsored by or played in connection with post-secondary institutions of education.

-1s: Limits Oregon Lottery college sports betting games to Division I sporting events. Establishes sideboards. Dedicates 50 percent of net proceeds of college sports betting games to the Opportunity Grant Fund.
