Dear Chair Holvey, Vice-Chair Drazan, Vice-Chair Smith-Warner, and Members of the Committee:

I am writing to you today on behalf of the Oregon Housing Alliance to express our support for the -10 amendments of HB 4015. The Housing Alliance has no position or concerns related to the other amendments of HB 4015.

The Oregon Housing Alliance is a coalition of ninety organizations from all parts of the state. Our members have come together with the knowledge that housing opportunity is the foundation on which all of our success is built – individual success as students, parents, workers, and community members as well as the success of our communities. We represent a diverse set of voices including non-profit housing developers, residents of affordable housing, local jurisdictions, and organizations working to meet basic needs in every corner of our state. We believe that all Oregonians need a safe, stable, and affordable place to call home.

All Oregonians deserve a safe, stable, and affordable place to call home. Today, we simply don't have enough affordable homes for people who need them, and vacancy rates have dropped precipitously towards zero in communities across Oregon. People – our neighbors and members of our community – are struggling with homelessness, housing instability, rent burdens, and to make ends meet and put food on the table.

The -10 amendments, presented by Representative Lawrence Spence, would create a pilot program to develop more creative housing options. The pilot program would support the development of new housing options through accessory dwelling units. Accessory dwelling units (ADUs), or 'mother in law' apartments are small homes which are most often placed in a backyard, and provide another home for someone.

This pilot program would support the placement of ADUs in the backyards of homeowners with a below median incomes, and would require that they be then rented to someone with a low income for at least ten years. The pilot would develop ADUs in both the Portland metro area and in rural communities. Two organizations have identified an interest and opportunity to participate in rural communities. There would be strong support of the financing, siting, development, and operation of the ADU by an experienced, affordable housing development organization.

We are incredibly excited about this pilot for several reasons – first, we know that so many homeowners are interested in developing ADUs to support a family member or a community member with housing, however the financing is often an extreme barrier, and only people with higher incomes or significant savings or equity are able to access ADUs. We hope that the pilot could identify a model or a product to help other homeowners access ADU financing. Second, we are excited about the provision of additional housing options for people with low incomes.

We urge your support of the -10 amendments to HB 4015. I would reiterate that the Housing Alliance has no position or concerns related to the other amendments of HB 4015, we have simply not considered the issue.
