The Portland area is getting requests for transportation projects that are too expensive for what they would accomplish:

- 1. I-5 Bridge Replacement. This adds virtually nothing to overall capacity and would contribute significantly to local traffic congestion. The real need is to address Washington County growth by building a new Columbia River bridge next to the BNSF tracks, with a connecting route to US 26 in Hillsboro. The I-5 Bridge Replacement would also result in significant tolls, with additional tolling needed in the future to correct the mistakes caused by it.
- 2. Rose Quarter Project. It should not be extraordinarily difficult to add one more through lane each way in the bottleneck below Broadway- Weidler Sts.. For a comparison ODOT has practically rebuilt and expanded a one mile section of I-84 in Troutdale for \$111 million. As far as correcting the roadway deficiencies in the Rose Quarter this should not be more than \$250 million maximum. The fact that it is now projected at 3x that much is because it is an urban renewal project pushed by vested interests.

The I-84 replacement and widening in Troutdale should serve as an example of what ODOT can do. It was cited in the Northwest Engineering Record as an outstanding project.

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
