

Session Length Limitations in Other States

Examples of States that use working days instead of calendar days

Kentucky Constitution

“The General Assembly, in odd-numbered years, shall meet in regular session for a period not to exceed a total of thirty (30) legislative days divided as follows”

Minnesota Constitution

“The legislature shall meet at the seat of government in regular session in each biennium at the times prescribed by law for not exceeding a total of 120 legislative days.”

Montana Constitution

“The legislature shall meet each odd-numbered year in regular session of not more than 90 legislative days.”

Nebraska Constitution

“The duration of regular sessions held shall not exceed ninety legislative days”

States with no session limits

Idaho, Illinois, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Wisconsin
