Measure Description:

Requires Oregon Health Authority, Oregon Liquor Control Commission, Oregon Department of Agriculture and Office of the Governor to collaborate with representatives of kratom industry to develop plan to address administrative burden and cost of regulation of kratom in this state. Prohibits kratom processor from distributing, selling or offering for sale kratom product to individual under 21 years of age.
