SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

Modifies limit for six-year period beginning July 1, 2015, on payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Oregon Military Department for capital construction.

Limits expenditures from federal funds collected or received by Oregon Military Department for

Youth Challenge Program expansion for six-year period beginning July 1, 2017, in lieu of expenditure limitation previously established by Emergency Board. Modifies limit for six-year period beginning July 1, 2019, on payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by certain state agencies for capital construction.

Modifies description of project for which expenditures are limited for six-year period beginning July 1, 2017.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.
