## B-Engrossed Senate Bill 1556

Ordered by the Senate February 28 Including Senate Amendments dated February 12 and February 28

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Authorizes Oregon Liquor Control Commission to create data and analysis regarding commercial sales and commercial industries. Authorizes commission to contract for services related to creating, marketing, selling or licensing use of data and analysis. Provides for disposition of moneys received from selling or licensing use of data and analysis.

[Establishes Oregon Liquor Control Commission Information Technology Infrastructure Fund.

[Establishes Oregon Liquor Control Commission Information Technology Infrastructure Fund. Appropriates fund moneys to commission for paying costs related to data and analysis program and for procuring, operating, maintaining, staffing and servicing information system hardware, software and supplies related to operational or revenue generating functions of commission. Appropriates commission net share of revenue from data and analysis program to fund.]

Authorizes commission to negotiate certain distilled liquor prices with Indian tribes and commercial airlines.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to the Oregon Liquor Control Commission; and prescribing an effective date.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

## DATA, ANALYSIS AND INFORMATION SYSTEMS

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SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Liquor Control Commission may create reports and analysis of commission data regarding commercial sales and commercial industries. The commission may market, sell, license the use of or offer other forms of value-added access to data and analysis described in this subsection to private entities.

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(2) The commission may enter into contracts with private entities for the entities to capture and compile commission data to create reports and analysis regarding commercial sales and commercial industries.

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(3) Commission data that a private entity captures or compiles under an agreement described in subsection (2) of this section is proprietary information of the commission.

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(4) The commission may enter into contracts with private entities for the entities to accept payments from sales or licenses for use of data and analysis described in subsection (1) of this section or any systems, processes or business models developed from that data or analysis. Payments that the commission or a private entity accepts from sales or licenses under this section:

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(a) Related to alcohol data and analysis shall be remitted for crediting as provided under ORS 471.805.

1	(b) Related to cannabis data and analysis shall be remitted for crediting to the Marijuana
2	Control and Regulation Fund.
3	(5) The commission shall ensure that data and analysis that the commission sells or li-
4	censes for use are in a format that preserves anonymity of the source and do not contain
5	personally identifiable information.
6	(6) The commission may adopt rules to:
7	(a) Ensure that personally identifiable information is not included in data or analysis;
8	(b) Control the use of data and analysis; and
9	(c) Establish prices or fees for the purchasing of, or other access to, data and analysis.

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13	SECTION 2. Sections 3 and 4 of this 2020 Act are added to and made a part of ORS
14	chapter 471.
15	SECTION 3. Notwithstanding ORS 471.175, an Indian tribe that holds a full on-premises
16	sales license may purchase distilled liquor for sale by the drink on tribal reservation land
17	directly from the Oregon Liquor Control Commission at a price negotiated by the Indian
18	tribe and the commission.
19	SECTION 4. Notwithstanding ORS 471.175, an airline described in ORS 471.182 that holds
20	a full on-premises sales license may purchase distilled liquor for sale to ticketed passengers
21	aboard a commercial aircraft directly from the Oregon Liquor Control Commission at a price
22	negotiated by the airline and the commission.
