**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 1543**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the semicolon insert “amending
2 ORS 497.162;”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 30 and delete page 2 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. ORS 497.162 is amended to read:**

5 “497.162. (1) Upon application of the Oregon Youth Authority, the Oregon
6 Health Authority or the Department of Human Services, the State Fish and
7 Wildlife Commission shall issue, without fee, a license to angle for the tem-
8 porary use of any person in a state institution as described in ORS 179.610,
9 any student in a youth correction facility or related camps or programs op-
10 erated by the Oregon Youth Authority, any child placed by the department
11 and under the care of a foster home or a child-caring agency licensed, cer-
12 tified or otherwise authorized by the department under ORS 418.205 to
13 418.327, any person in an alternative to state hospitalization program as de-
14 scribed in ORS 430.630 (2)(b) or (c), or any person receiving services under
15 ORS 430.664. The licenses issued under this subsection shall be in bearer
16 form and, subject to applicable laws and regulations relating to angling,
17 shall be used as the agency applying for the license directs.

18 “(2) Upon application of the Department of Human Services, the commis-
19 sion shall issue, without fee, a license to take shellfish for the temporary
20 use of any child placed by the department and under the care of a foster
21 home or a child-caring agency licensed, certified or otherwise authorized by

1 the department under ORS 418.205 to 418.327. The licenses issued under this
2 subsection shall be in bearer form and, subject to applicable laws and regu-
3 lations relating to taking shellfish, shall be used as the department directs.

4 *“(3) Upon application of the director of any veteran’s administration hos-
5 pital or domiciliary within this state, the commission shall issue, without fee,
6 to each hospital or domiciliary 30 licenses to angle or to take shellfish for the
7 temporary use of any person who is a patient or resident in the hospital or
8 domiciliary. The licenses issued under this subsection shall be in bearer form
9 and, subject to applicable laws and regulations relating to angling and to
10 taking shellfish, shall be used as the director of the hospital or domiciliary
11 provides.]*

12 **“(3)(a) As used in this subsection, ‘armed forces members’ means
13 active duty members of the Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marine
14 Corps or Navy.**

15 **“(b) Upon application of the director of a veteran’s administration
16 hospital or domiciliary within this state, or by the director of a
17 nonprofit organization in this state that serves armed forces members
18 whose duty station is a warrior transition unit or serves veterans, the
19 commission shall issue, without fee, to the hospital, domiciliary or
20 organization a group license for use by patients or other recipients of
21 hospital, domiciliary or organization services to angle or take shellfish
22 during hospital, domiciliary or organization excursions. A group li-
23 cense issued under this subsection shall be in bearer form and, subject
24 to applicable laws and regulations relating to angling or taking
25 shellfish, shall be used as the director of the hospital, domiciliary or
26 organization directs. Patients or other recipients of hospital,
27 domiciliary or organization services who participate in angling or the
28 taking of shellfish under a group license issued under this subsection
29 are not required to have any individual license, permit, tag, endorse-
30 ment or other authorization for that angling or taking.**

1 “(c) The group license must be in the possession of a hospital,
2 domiciliary or organization staff member accompanying the partic-
3 ipants angling or taking shellfish under the group license. A group li-
4 cense issued to a hospital, domiciliary or nonprofit organization under
5 this subsection shall have a term of one year. A patient or other re-
6 cipient of hospital, domiciliary or organization services may not par-
7 ticipate in more than three group license excursions in a year.

8 “SECTION 2. This 2020 Act being necessary for the immediate
9 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
10 declared to exist, and this 2020 Act takes effect on its passage.”.

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
