

Dear Legislators,

We, the Young Democrats of Oregon and over 200 co-signers from over 40 different cities, urge you to pass meaningful legislation to make police departments across our state accountable to the people they are sworn to protect. The murders of George Floyd and Breonna Taylor, as well as subsequent incidents of police violence against demonstrators have exemplified to our state and nation what young people--especially young Black Americans--have been saying for decades about unchecked police power. We affirm that Black lives matter and that an injury to one is an injury to all, and demand that you move decisively to address the ongoing emergency of police violence. *An important first step is to pass LC 49.*

Right now, law enforcement officers in Oregon are able to take advantage of inconsistent standards allowing for nominal punishments to be given out in disciplinary situations. For example, in 2014, Portland Police Captain Todd Wyatt used this weakness to restore his rank after a review board found him guilty of inappropriately touching female employees and brandishing his gun and badge during a road rage incident. In 2012, the board recommended that Wyatt be fired, but then-Chief Mike Reese merely demoted him to Lieutenant, and an arbitrator reversed his demotion just two years later.

LC 49 provides for the creation of disciplinary guides for law enforcement officers and prohibits deviation by arbitrators from disciplinary guides. This means that elected officials, government agencies, and police chiefs will have greater ability to shape standardized disciplinary practices for law enforcement officers. LC 49 also rightly declares that the acts it contains are immediately necessary for the protection of "peace, health, and safety," so that its provisions may be made effective immediately.

While important, LC 49 is not a cure-all. Much work remains to be done to solve institutional racism and violence in policing. Other bills, such as LC 78, which creates a centralized database of Oregon law enforcement disciplinary records, are also in the works, and should be passed, too. Yet LC 49 makes progress toward justice by reducing law enforcement officers' ability to act outside the law. It takes discipline out of backroom dealing, and encourages law enforcement agencies to codify the values they claim to represent, and forces them to back those values up with action.

Institutional indifference empowers individual bad actors. Our government has allowed law enforcement agencies too much unchecked power, and has sent the message that the State prioritizes the illusion of agency discipline over the safety of its people. We urge you to uphold the State's portion of its Constitutional social compact by ending the legalized impunity by which our own Constitutionally-sworn officers continue to violate Oregonians rights to "peace, safety, and happiness." LC 49 will play an important role in addressing the crisis of police violence in Oregon. **We urge you to vote YES.**
