Measure Description:

Provides that a peace officer is not justified in any circumstance in knowingly using physical force that impedes the normal breathing or circulation of the blood of another person by applying pressure on the throat or neck of the other person, unless the circumstance is one in which the peace officer may use deadly physical force as provided in ORS 161.239.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Cities, Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST), Oregon Judicial Department (OJD), Department of Justice (DOJ), Counties, Oregon State Police (OSP)

Analysis:

The proposed legislation has been determined to have
