SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Appropriates moneys from General Fund to _____ for biennial expenses.] [Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by _____.]

[Limits biennial expenditures of _ from federal funds.]

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to specified state agencies for certain biennial expenses.

Modifies certain biennial appropriations made from General Fund to Emergency Board and specified state agencies.

Establishes and modifies limitations on expenditures for certain biennial expenses for specified state agencies.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Emergency Board by section 1, chapter 644, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, is decreased by \$1,448,157. SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Office of the Governor, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$175,000 for expenses related to forest mediation sessions. SECTION 3. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the State Forestry Department, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$844,545 for expenses related to notifications for pesticide application by helicopter to forestland. SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$70,362 is established for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and including federal funds from the United States Forest Service for fire protection and for research projects, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or received by the State Forestry Department, for expenses related to notifications for pesticide application by helicopter to forestland.

21SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the State Department of Agriculture by section 1 (2), chapter 452, Oregon Laws 2019, 2223for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for food safety, is increased by \$237,648 for the es-

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1 tablishment of a state inspection program for the processing and sale of meat products.

2 <u>SECTION 6.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation 3 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (1), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, 4 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for central services and state assessments and 5 enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$137,042 for the purpose of licensing and monitoring 6 out-of-state child-caring agencies.

SECTION 7. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (3), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019,
for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for child welfare, is increased by \$53,922 for costs as sociated with managing out-of-state placements and covering service payments.

SECTION 8. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on 11 12 expenditures established by section 2 (5), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or 13 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal 14 15 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries 16 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Depart-17 18 ment of Human Services, for shared services, is increased by \$119,328 for the purpose of li-19 censing and monitoring out-of-state child-caring agencies.

20 <u>SECTION 9.</u> This 2020 special session Act being necessary for the immediate preservation 21 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2020 special 22 session Act takes effect on its passage.

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
